ELECTION ALERT: DO YOU HAVE VOTER ID?

Among the many millions of votes cast in the 2019 general election, just one person was convicted of voting fraudulently and one other received a police caution. In the 2021 local elections, there were no convictions and one caution [Source: UK Electoral Commission]. To head off this sinister trend before it completely overwhelms the democratic process, the Government has very sensibly decreed that all voters must carry approved photographic identity whenever they visit a polling station — and the first time that this new rule will apply is in the local elections on May 4th. This means that if you want to vote in May, you'll have to do ONE of these three things in April:

- 1. Ensure that you have one of the approved forms of photo ID. These are: Passport issued by the UK, Channel Islands, Isle of Man, a British Overseas Territory, an EEA state or a Commonwealth country Full or provisional photo driving licence issued by the UK, the Channel Islands, the Isle of Man or an EEA state a Blue Badge UK Government-funded Older Person's Bus Pass, Disabled Person's Bus Pass or Oyster 60+ Card Freedom Pass Scottish National Entitlement Card Welsh 60 and Over Travel Card or Disabled Person's Travel Card Northern Ireland-issued Electoral Identity Card, Senior SmartPass, Registered Blind SmartPass, Blind Person's SmartPass, War Disablement SmartPass, 60+ SmartPass or Half Fare SmartPass a proof-of-age PASS card Biometric immigration document Defence Identity Card National identity card issued by an EEA state.
- 2. If you don't have any of these documents, apply for a free Voter Authority Certificate **by 5 pm on April 25th**. You can apply via the UK Government website at https://bit.ly/4084F5J or request a postal application form from the Vale of White Horse District Council by calling 01235 422528.
- 3. If you'd rather not go to a polling station at all, apply for a postal vote **by 5 pm on April 18th** or a proxy vote **by 5 pm on April 25th**. For details of how to apply for a postal vote, visit the Vale's website at https://bit.ly/42ytn0G or call 01235 422528. For details on proxy votes, go to https://bit.ly/3JEqmnf or call the same number.

FREQUENTLY ASKED BULLETIN QUESTIONS

Among the many enquiries the Bulletin receives every month, some crop up far more frequently than others. So to save everybody a bit of time in future, here are the answers in advance!

- When is the deadline for articles in the Bulletin? The copy deadline for the next Bulletin is always given on the back page of the current Bulletin and on the home page of the Blewbury website (www.blewbury.co.uk). Deadlines for all Bulletins in the current year can be found on the Bulletin Editorial page of the website.
- How much does it cost to advertise in the Bulletin? Again, full details of advertising costs, sizes and deadlines can be found on the back page of the printed edition and on the Bulletin Advertising page of the website.
- Can I have a quarter/half/full page advert? Sorry, no; all our ads are smaller than that. See previous answer.
- How much does it cost to put family announcements (births, marriages, deaths etc) in the Bulletin? Nothing as with any other piece of standard editorial, these are always free of charge.
- Is there a maximum length for submitted articles? We ask for a maximum of 500 words, and nearer 400 if there is an accompanying photo. We also reserve the right to edit articles down to below these levels if space is limited.
- When will the next Bulletin be delivered? A team of over 30 distributors deliver the Bulletin to every household in Blewbury during the week following the copy deadline. For example, the deadline for this Bulletin was Wednesday March 22nd, so it was delivered during the week commencing Monday March 27th. Exactly which day you get your copy depends on your local distributor, but we aim to have the whole village covered by the last Saturday of the month. In addition, an electronic version of the Bulletin is available on the Blewbury website from the Monday of each delivery week, and there is a paid-for mailing service for readers outside the village who prefer a printed copy.
- Why are you still producing the Bulletin on paper? Because almost everyone tells us that's what they want, and for some it's the only way they can read it. From a sustainability point of view, it's worth noting that following a trial of various recycled paper stocks last summer, no new paper is now used in the production of the printed Bulletin.

BLEWBURY POST OFFICE NEWS

As expected, Royal Mail have announced the price of postage from 3rd April: 1st class will go up by 15p to £1.15, while 2nd class goes up by 7p to 75p, large letters stamps go up too. It's worthwhile buying a few extra before then, as they revalue themselves automatically. New King Charles stamps go on sale that day too. Speaking of stamps, please use up any non-barcoded stamps before the end of July (the pictorial ones are ok to use after that) and please don't tear off the barcode on the newer ones, they need that bit! You can download a swap-out form from the Royal Mail website, and send off any you are not going to use before the cut-off date.

International parcels can now be processed with us, but you must have the appropriate customs labels applied and filled out before you get to the counter because we now have to input the data onto our system, which takes a few minutes per parcel.

We have Duck Race tickets available, along with tickets for various other events. Please note that you can only pay with cash, but you can take cash out at the counter as usual.

I've handed in my resignation letter, and the new postmaster is about to go on his training, so you may see him in the branch by the end of April, but I'm afraid you've still got me until June!

We'll be closed for Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Sunday and Monday (April 7th to 10th) and reopen on Tuesday 11th, allowances and pensions will be paid the previous working day. With this in mind, we are exploring an investment opportunity that would allow us to *buy* a house in Blewbury. For the first 2-3 years this would house a refugee family, but thereafter it could be offered at an affordable rent to any local family in need. A modern-day alms house, funded by the local community...

At the meeting, we will hear from Homes With Purpose (<u>www.homeswithpurpose.org</u>), an Oxford charity which has bought and rented out six homes in the city using the same model that ReST proposes to use. There will also be ample opportunity to ask questions over drinks and nibbles.

The Easter Message

Have you ever wondered why Christians make such a fuss over the celebration of Easter? Christians have been celebrating the resurrection of Jesus ever since the very first Easter morning. We tend to associate the celebration of the resurrection with one particular day in the church's year: Easter Day, which this year falls on 9th April. But the resurrection is in fact celebrated every week, in the usual Sunday service. Jesus rose again from the dead on a Sunday morning, and this is why the tradition arose of Christians going to church on a Sunday, and why Sundays have been kept as a special day, different from the other days of the week.



What makes Easter so special? In part, it is because Christians have seen Jesus' resurrection as God's seal of approval for all that Jesus did and taught. How can we be certain that Jesus is truly who he claimed to be? Yes, we can point to the coherence and truth of his teaching. Yes, we can point to the fact that his life and teaching has attracted countless millions of disciples down the centuries, and continues to do so. But we can also point to the fact of the resurrection: by this unique miracle, God affirmed that Jesus is indeed the Son of God.

But there is more to Easter than this. It shows us that death is not necessarily the end. If God raised Jesus from the dead and gave him new life, there is hope for us too. God can raise us from the dead, too. Death is not the end. It is the gateway to new life- the resurrection life. The resurrection of Jesus gives us hope.

Finally, the resurrection life is eternal life: it is life lived with God for ever. So this means that Jesus is alive today, in his resurrected body, and will be alive for ever more. He can guide us and help us today, and we can share in his life through baptism and holy communion. Most of us will never see Jesus in his resurrected body, but many of us will experience his presence through our prayer and worship, in the life of the Christian community, and in the love we share with one another in our everyday lives.

No wonder Christians continue to celebrate Easter day with such joy!



NATURE NOTES: LADYBIRDS

Ladybird, Ladybird, tell to me, What the weather is going to be, If it is fair, then fly to the air, If foul then fall to the ground.

Ladybirds are one of Britain's most recognised and well-loved creatures and April is normally the month when on a warm day you can start to see them emerge from their winter lodgings. As a popular insect it has many colloquial names: in my native Suffolk I know them as Bishy-Barnabees, but other names include Clock o' Clay, Ladycow, Golden Knop and Reed Sodger.

The use of 'Ladybird' stretches back to the Middle Ages and in particular to the cult of the Virgin Mary. In art, Our Lady is often depicted in blue (the most expensive of dyes), in others red (representing the blood of Christ). The most common of ladybirds is the Seven Spotted and thus the mystic number seven becomes part of the symbolism of the ladybird as a wholesome bug. As insects were considered a lowly animal at the time, (and unfortunately still today!) the insect became a bird ... well, they do fly at least!

However, the Ladybird's heavenly reputation is unwarranted when we study them in the wild. They are highly promiscuous species and have a penchant for cannibalism! Cannibalism normally occurs at the larval stage. It is vital for the newly hatched larva to feed as quickly possible and if a sibling is in the way instead of an Aphid, then so be it. However, this behaviour can become much more complicated. Some mother ladybirds contain a bacterium that can only be transmitted to daughters but is lethal to males, thus when the females hatch, they benefit greatly from a nearby immobilised snack!

In the UK we have 47 species (over 6000 worldwide, 260 in Europe), but they are not all your classic 'red with black spots' species. Some can be hairy such as the Ant-nest Ladybird. The 22-spot Ladybird is a vivid yellow with black spots. Our more inconspicuous species can also be very small indeed; the Dot Ladybird is just 1.5mm long! Despite its small stature it can consume 150 spider mites a day and is a good pest controller in orchards. Unfortunately, Ladybirds, like most insects, have suffered severe declines. As well as the usual suspects of habitat destruction and climate change, the advance of the non-native Harlequin Ladybird also has a competitive edge over our native species. So this spring let us make space in all our gardens for one of Britain's most charming and useful insects!

FROM OUR CANADIAN CORRESPONDENT

Now that I'm a bona fide Resident of Canada, I should start using the local terminology, which differs from UK-speak in many different areas! I've mentioned sidewalk and pavement before but don't think I advised that the strip of grass down the street between the pavement and the road is called the boulevard, where residents are encouraged to dig up the grass and plant their own trees and shrubs, or erect wooden raised beds; it makes less to mow for the homeowner, whose responsibility it is to keep it tidy!

In buildings, I still find it confusing that the **ground** floor is referred to as the **first** floor, whereas in a lift (elevator), sometimes the ground floor is also called the main floor! Houses contain a positive minefield of misapprehensions, where skirting boards are known as baseboards (much more logical) and architraves become mouldings. The oldfashioned (but achieving a new popularity) dado rail is a chair rail, plasterboard is sheetrock or drywall, and roofing tiles are shingles (often made of asphalt reinforced with fibreglass) unless made of ceramic when they are still tiles, cladding is siding and render is stucco. Here, your house is built by a General Contractor, versus a General Builder in the UK, who has to comply with planning codes, not building regs, to obtain your Building Permit/Planning Permission. A casement window becomes an awning window, and the dreadful Artex ceilings are popcorn ceilings - again a better description! Tongue and groove becomes clapboard, gutters are eaves troughs and drainpipes become downspouts. Foundations are footings, lofts or attics are crawlspaces, sliding patio doors are picture windows, ordinary window frames are window cases. With the utilities, central heating and ventilation is HVAC and the downstairs toilet is often referred to as a washroom or half-bath! The tap is a faucet, a bucket is a pail, and dustsheets are drop cloths. And finally, the display cabinet on top of a sideboard is called a hutch on a credenza! We are more familiar with the food names: Courgettes are zucchini, aubergines are eggplant, broad beans are fava beans and coriander is cilantro. However, baking terms are very confusing: a scone sometimes becomes a biscuit, but a biscuit is a cookie!! And jam is often jelly, but jelly is jello! And lastly, soda is any carbonated beverage... In the garden (yard), my pet peeve is a garden fork being called a pitchfork; I try to tell them that it is used for pitching bales of straw and only has two tines, but to no avail! LETTER FROM DAVID JOHNSTON MP

My constituency-wide survey on local health services is currently open. It's just 8 questions long and should only take about 5 minutes (no more than 10) and you can complete it until 17th April on my website: https://www.david-johnston.org.uk/health. [Editor's note: those without internet access can call the Bulletin on 851055 for a hard copy] Increasing our health services relative to the population growth we've had is one of the things I have campaigned on most since being elected 3 years ago — particularly the need for more GP surgeries. I've spoken about this in 19 debates in parliament and had numerous meetings with the local councils, local health leaders, ministers and local people about it. The more people who complete it, the stronger the message we can send.

I held a successful inaugural meeting of my Science and Technology Forum for the companies we have at Harwell, Milton Park and elsewhere which George Freeman, the Minister at the new Science Department, spoke at. He and I are very keen to promote what is going on here more as it is of both national and international significance — and we discussed some good ideas to do so. Watch this space!

I'll be holding an Apprenticeship Fair for local young people and employers across the constituency at Didcot Civic Hall on 24th April. I visit at least 1 school and at least 1 employer almost every week (and have been to 600 odd organisations overall since being elected) and I hear regularly that young people don't know the apprenticeships open to them and that employers struggle to recruit enough apprentices. I'm hopeful this fair will help.

My campaigning on behalf of the local AEAT Pensioners has been bearing fruit: the National Audit Office has published its report on the case following my request and Parliament's Public Accounts Committee recently held a hearing on it, with their own report to come.

A few highlights from many visits in the last month. It was good to be interviewed on Wallingford Radio which has been going great guns since it got its FM license. You can listen live on 107.3FM. I had a great visit to the new wedding dress shop in Wantage, About You Bridal, set up by Sharon to make the process of buying dresses, shoes and accessories as stress-free as possible. It's also home to Gallery Cakes, set up by Nicki, so that you can order your wedding cake too! It was very good to see The Place in the Corn Exchange in Faringdon, having seen the space when it was just an idea, which supports parents and their children under 5. I also met Keith and Sue to talk about the Faringdon Day Centre and will be back to visit that soon. And I'm pleased to say Michael Gove was very impressed with the Greencore Construction houses I took him to see in Southmoor.





BLEWBURY SCHOOL GOES GREEN IN PARTNERSHIP WITH SUSTAINABLE BLEWBURY!

An exciting new partnership between Blewbury School and Sustainable Blewbury is looking at green issues such as sustainability and care for the natural environment. The immediate focus is on developments within the School grounds, which are of course very extensive and look out over some superb farmland and downs views. It is a key part of the School's curriculum to explore and educate pupils about sustainability, biodiversity, the environment and climate change, and so this project ties in very neatly with the children's ongoing studies and curriculum coverage.

A recent site visit from Camilla Burrow and Sean Morris, of Sustainable Blewbury, accompanied by the headteacher Jo Reeder, and community governor Roger Murphy, led to the development of a list of suggestions about simple but effective improvements that could be made to further develop the very beautiful school grounds. These suggestions include adapting the School's existing Forest School site; creating a corner to plant native species of woodland bulbs, and dedicating an area to establish a long grass wildflower meadow.






Following this the School would like to add native aquatic oxygenating plants. Can you help us with this? We would love the Blewbury community to donate a few plants from your garden ponds. Species such as Amphibious Bistort (Persicaria amphibia), Broad-leaved Pondweed (Potamogeton natans), Fringed Water-lily (Nymphoides peltata) or White Water-lily (Nymphaea alba) would be ideal. And while we are asking for help the School Gardening Club urgently needs the equivalent of eight bags of compost to re-stock their raised beds ready for the 2023 vegetable growing season.
