TEMPORARY ROAD CLOSURES IN MAY

Oxfordshire County Council will be closing and imposing a 'No Waiting' restriction on the following roads this month:

- Blewbury Road (B4016) between East Hagbourne and Sheencroft, to facilitate the resurfacing of the carriageway
 and the subsequent reinstatement of all road markings and lines. This closure will operate from 2 May up to and
 including 4 May between 07:00 and 19:00.
- A417 between junction of Spring Lane and junction of Westfield Road, Aston Tirrold, for carriageway surfacing
 works/repairs. This closure will operate from 15 May 2023 up to and including 04 June between 20:00 and 06:00.
- Brooke Lane, from West Hagbourne to Coscote for surface dressing works. This closure will operate from 25 May
 up to and including 26 May between 04:00 and 20:00.





Our next REPAIR CAFE: Sunday 21 May, Blewbury Village Hall, 2 – 4 pm

This will be our ninth Repair Cafe, so you might think they are becoming a tried and tested routine for the organisers, but this does not happen. Repair Cafes depend on volunteers, and they are not always available. At our last Cafe: 6 days before the event I was four repairers short, no one running the cafe and I was short of cakes. Fortunately, I know many of the other local organisers, and a sharpener and lady who mends clothes at Cholsey both volunteered to help, but she then tested positive for Covid. Luckily my daughter volunteered to mend clothes and my grand-daughter helped out at the cafe. I estimate that there must be about 200 local people who have had things repaired and have seen that some of the repairs do not require professional skills. Ideally, I'd like a list of people I can ask to help occasionally. The skills we need are electrical repairs, sharpening, household repairs, mending and altering clothes, and bike repairs, also helping at the cafe and on reception. A Significant Number

Are you interested in numbers? Sometimes numbers can express someth ing very particular and precise, but on other occasions numbers serve to express a more general idea. For example, if someone said to you, "I'll be with you in 5 minutes", does this mean that they will be with you in precisely 5 minutes' time, or does it mean that they will be with you shortly? Clearly, the meaning of "5 minutes" depends on the context. The same is true of references to time in the Bible: sometimes the reference to a period of time should be taken quite literally, and on other occasions, it needs to be interpreted more loosely.



You may well wonder: why have I chosen to write about time? The reason is that this month will see the celebration of Ascension Day, which is by tradition celebrated 40 days after Easter. This year, Ascension Day falls on 18th May, and in our group of churches we will mark the occasion by a special service at Blewbury. Ascension Day commemorates the occasion when Jesus was "taken up to heaven": "he was lifted up, and a cloud took him out of ... sight". The fullest reference to this mysterious event is found in the first chapter of the Acts of the Apostles. I describe the event as "mysterious" because something mysterious happened to Jesus' resurrected body, and the event has been remembered ever since. In terms of when it happened, the account in the Acts of the Apostles points to it happening 40 days from Easter Day. However, in the Bible "40 days" is sometimes used quite loosely to express an indefinite but significant period of time. So when we read that the Ascension took place "40 days" after Easter, the reference to 40 days does not necessarily have to be interpreted literally.

Why is the Ascension celebrated? In essence, it's because it is the companion festival to Christmas. At Christmas, we celebrate Jesus coming down from Heaven, being born as a human being; at the Ascension, we celebrate Jesus returning to Heaven, but still retaining his human nature. It's a way of saying that although we no longer have sightings of the risen Jesus in our day to day lives, he remains alive, fully human and fully divine. He is still present, caring for us and for our world – not just today, but for all time. This is good news indeed!



LETTER FROM DAVID JOHNSTON MP

Although I live in Didcot, I saw it and many other places in the constituency in a different light last month: from the back of a police car! No, I hadn't done anything wrong, I'd asked to go on a 'Ride Along' with the local force to get a better insight into the demands on the police as they respond to the calls they receive at the station. It turned out to be a relatively quiet 4 or so hours, but it was nonetheless fascinating to talk to PCs David and Alex about their experience in the force, the things they've had to respond to, how they're treated by the public and the things they'd like to see change. They perform a very difficult and vital role and I'm very grateful to them for letting me accompany them.

I continue to be on the case regarding the experience of parents and schools with Oxfordshire's service for children with Special Educational Needs. I spoke in a debate in parliament about some of the problems and then met the Government minister responsible for SEND nationally. Oxfordshire has just been given a further £1 million by the Government to deliver outreach services from SEND specialists to support children with a variety of conditions including autism and moderate learning difficulties. But this won't solve the problems people complain to me about regarding calls and emails not being answered and so I will continue to work on this.

On the subject of government funding, the extension to the Energy Price Guarantee for a further 3 months is welcome and will have saved the average household £1100 since it began, while Oxfordshire County Council has just been given a further £3 million to fix the potholes so many of you rightly complain to me about!

The Public Accounts Committee have held their hearing into the local AEAT Pension case I've been campaigning on behalf of and now we have to wait for their report in the coming weeks. I must give credit to OX10 Community Centre, Wild About Wallingford, the Town Council and Incredible Edible for keeping their Public Living Room going at the Bull Croft through a miserable afternoon of rain. It was designed to bring the community together and it did – at least some of them, and a great ukulele band. I had a good catch up with GWR about where next to take my campaign for reopening Grove Station – watch this space.

Straight after my Apprenticeship Fair on 24th April at 12pm at Didcot Civic Hall, I will start planning this year's Wantage and Didcot Climate Summit on 13th June.



FROM OUR CANADIAN CORRESPONDENT

Some more Canadian oddities!

What we know as a Beanie hat or a woolly cap is here called a Toque (tuque or touque, pronounced TOOK), not to be confused with Queen Alexandra's favourite headgear OR a chef's Toque (that large white one).

I'm aware that postmen in the UK tend to wear shorts through the direst weather, but here it seems to be taken to extremes, with (usually) men leaping into their shorts while there is still snow on the ground in early March. However, I have also seen the fashion oddity of full-length joggers worn under shorts, presumably for warmth! And why is the Royal Canadian Mounted Police so called when they haven't used horses (except for rare ceremonial occasions) when on patrol since 1936! However, Toronto does have a Mounted Police Unit that is part of the municipal Toronto Police Service, but is not RCMP. As in the UK, horses are still occasionally used for crowd control as they are much more manoeuvrable than cars.

One of the oddest favourite Canadian foods is Poutine, a Quebecois dish first invented in the 1950s and now popular across Canada, comprising French fries and cheese curds (un-aged "squeaky" cheese!), topped with brown gravy... Surely the most unusual local accent has to be Newfoundland English, or perhaps Cape Breton English in Nova Scotia; on a delightful Home Renovation show that we watch which is based in Newfoundland (Newfie), they put sub-titles on the screen to help foreigners (anyone who hasn't lived there for over 100 years). It sounds somewhat similar to Northern Irish, which I suppose is probably where many of the original settlers came from.

As in the USA, dollars are bucks – but in Canada they are also called Loonies, named after the Loon, a bird featured on the coin. And the two-dollar coin is not called a Polar because of the bear pictured on it, but a Toonie, because it rhymes!! Weird.

I attended my first ever Bridal Shower last weekend – I seemed to be out of the country decades ago whenever any of my girlfriends got married – which included "High Tea" at 11am! True, there were finger sandwiches, scones and jam/cream, and some little pastries. There was also a lot of pink champagne, followed by coffee and/or tea. I suppose it couldn't be called "Brunch" as it did not include any of the breakfast dishes normally included in that meal. Confusing, though! *Angela Hoy (angelahoy23@gmail.com)*

NATURE NOTES

But when eve shines lowly,
And the light is thinned,
And the moon slides slowly
Down the far-off wind,
Oh, then to be of all the birds the Swift!
To flit through ether, with elves winging,
Drawn up western fires, in frenzy singing.

Extract from *The Swift* by Wilfred Owen (1893 – 1918)

I managed to spot my first Swallow in Blewbury on the 11th April. Along with the Brimstone Butterfly, the first call of the Chiff-Chaff and the opening of the Lesser Celandine, these are my markers along nature's inexorable path towards spring. A few days later I spotted my first Sand Martin, skimming along the River Thames. There is always an excitement in glimpsing the return of a migratory species, and nowadays with global ecosystem under increasing pressure almost a sense of relief that species are still criss-crossing the Earth. One of the later migratory species to make it to our shores in May, and the one I look forward to the most is the return of the Swift.

The scientific name for the Swift, *Apus apus*, is derived from the Greek for 'without feet' and although technically they possess 'feet', they are small and vestigial. But the Swift has not much need for them as they are completely adapted to a life on the wing. They weigh no heavier than a hen's egg, yet can travel 200,000km per year. They are the fastest birds in the world in level flight. Almost everything is done on the wing. They are the only bird to mate in the air, they collect all their nest materials from the air and most remarkably they can sleep in the air. Utilising a state of unihemispheric sleep (Dolphins and Penguins and no doubt some Blewbarians can also do this!). They can shut down half of their brain. The other half remains alert as the bird circles high in the sky so it can remain on course during its long migration, or when settled, wake in the same place it went to slumber.

Despite being on Earth for over 70 million years, Swift numbers in recent times continue to fall. Insect numbers have plummeted and so they have less food, more arid areas in Africa makes migration more challenging. When they get here the old buildings and roof spaces have been blocked or demolished (erecting a swift box really can help!). We know this partly due to the long-term data collected from the tower at the Oxford Natural History Museum. Research started there in 1947 and continues to this day. Last year they arrived back at the tower on the 16th May 2022, two weeks later than usual! I can't wait to once again hear their screeches and see their acrobatic flight over the rooftops of Blewbury. *Glen Meadows*

Choir

We are very fortunate that our Headteacher loves singing and she has been working with a School Choir, and taking them to sing in some great venues. A few weeks ago she took the choir to a Music Festival at Didcot Girls School, where over 260 children were taking part. Each school sang two songs then all the choirs joined together to sing one final song, which made it a great experience. Bryn Gibson, Head of Harwell School, said following the event 'Your children were fantastic today. They sang with joy and enthusiasm which gave me goosebumps!' Then a few days later they went off to perform in the stunning and acoustically brilliant setting of Christ Church Cathedral in Oxford, which was an experience most of them will never forget. At the Cathedral they joined other ODST schools for the first ever ODST singing event, and by all accounts they did very well and the whole of Blewbury village should be proud of them and Miss Reader of course.

As well as these activities there are other very active after-school clubs for gardening, volleyball and cricket. So if you see some children going home in their red jumpers later on in the afternoon you will have some idea what they may have been doing! *Roger Murphy and Sarah Mols, School Governors*

Local News - Didcot & Villages Healthcare

The Buckinghamshire, Oxfordshire and Berkshire West Integrated Care Board, with the support of officers from Vale of White Horse District Council and South Oxfordshire District Council, has been considering options to provide more GP consulting space in Didcot while longer term plans are made for delivery of new GP premises at Great Western Park. Options reviewed included the conversion of some rooms in the Great Western Park District (community) Centre to be used temporarily for primary care or creating temporary space or a permanent extension on the existing Woodlands Medical Centre site to provide more space for patient care.

All options present some challenges. However, a decision has been made by the ICB to seek to increase the space in the short term on the current Woodlands Medical Centre site. PARISH COUNCIL

Notes of the Parish Council's meeting: 7pm, Wednesday 12 April 2023, Vale Room, Blewbury Village Hall.

Present: Dermot Mathias (chair), Lydia Inglis, Vaughan Humphries, Lee Robinson, Mark Shayler and Michael Penington. Also present Elizabeth Cooper (clerk), David Hollick (lengthman) and District Councillor Hayleigh Gascoigne. Apologies were received from Anne Millman and County Councillor Sally Povolotsky.

This month the PC bids farewell to Michael Penington, who has served as a councillor for eight years, and Vaughan Humphries, who has served for four years. Michael has worked tirelessly on the Clubhouse in recent years, and brought his financial and environmental expertise to bear in countless useful PC discussions. Vaughan has been our Facebook communicator, defibrillator champion and risk/compliance monitor. We thank them both very much indeed for all their work in our community.

Before the PC meeting Matthew Barber, Police and Crime Commissioner for the Thames Valley, spent an hour discussing speeding traffic on Blewbury's main roads. Prompted by questions from Blewbury Speed Watch, Mr Barber has undertaken to confirm that letters are *definitely* being sent by TVP to persistent speeders. He also said he would consult Dorset Police about their strategy of deploying police patrols to support randomly-selected Speed Watch groups in that county. The PC will report back on both points. Mr Barber reinforced the positive nature of speed calming measures (as opposed to enforcement action for people who are already speeding). To that end, the PC's new speed-activated indicator devices (SIDs) should be erected in various locations on both Bessels Way and London Road soon. In combination with the work of Speed Watch, the PC expects the SIDs to reduce persistent speeding behaviour over the coming months. OCC councillor Sally Povolotsky provided additional information for questioners – it is OCC who sets speed limits and can plan to install traffic calming measures beyond the PC's capacity. Prompted by the discussions, Blewbury PC has officially asked OCC for a 20mph limit on both Bessels Way and London Road – this will be considered in 2024.

There are now two working defibrillators in the village – one at the Village Hall and another at the Blueberry PH. A third is planned for the Clubhouse once this is back in use.

The Annual Meeting of the Parish, facilitated by the Parish Council, will take place on **Wednesday 26 April at 7.30pm** in the village hall. This will be preceded by the Blewbury Village Society's AGM at 7pm.

Issues have also been raised with the PC about limited parking on the road adjacent to the application site.
