#### **BELL RINGING NEWS FROM BLEWBURY TOWER**

On the morning of 6<sup>th</sup> May, fifteen of our band (only two of us absent) took part in the national ringing celebration for the coronation of King Charles III. This follows the tradition in Blewbury of ringing for coronations, the last one being a quarter peal of Grandsire Triples rung on 2<sup>nd</sup> June 1953 to celebrate the coronation of Queen Elizabeth II. There will be more celebratory ringing this month as we will be ringing for a wedding. Then, on Saturday 1<sup>st</sup> July, we are very privileged to welcome back the **Westminster Abbey Company of Bellringers** (the most accomplished ringers in the UK), who will be ringing a full peal of 5040 changes to celebrate the conclusion of the Blewbury Window Project with the unveiling of the glass peal board designed by Rachel Phillips. The ringing will start at 1pm and will last for about 3 hours, and it will most definitely be something to listen out for. Our new curate Mark Rhodes-Smith will be joining us at 4pm for the blessing of the peal board.

Sadly Jackie Gardiner, one of Blewbury's long standing ringers, died earlier this month and we are privileged to be able to ring during her interment to remember her and celebrate her life. We are also planning to ring a quarter peal of Stedman Triples in her memory, Stedman being Jackie's favourite method.




Sadly, following a spate of anti-social behaviour and vandalism, **St Michael's Church will** remain closed during the day for the foreseeable future.

#### The Playclose

You may have noticed some works in the Playclose during the course of the year, but did you know this beautiful piece of land is owned by the Church? The PCC, as custodians of this special green space in the heart of the village, recently put in hand a project to conserve and enhance nature here and make access easier for villagers and visitors alike.

In February the wonderful volunteers form Sustainable Blewbury re-laid the northern hedge in a traditional manner, now summer has arrived this is looking healthy and growing well.

In May the public footpaths were widened in a sensitive way using appropriate materials, this was carried out by the helpful team

from Southern Construction & Surfacing. The paths are now much more suitable for pushchairs and wheelchairs. Both these works were kindly supported by a grant from the Trust for Oxfordshire's Environment with funding from Grundon Waste Management through the Landfill Communities Fund.

Further works planned include some tree management over the chalk stream and selective planting, to continue to support and increase biodiversity in this very special location.

#### The Gift and Responsibility of Liberty

The summer is finally here - a time for holidays and outdoor parties. It is also a good time to celebrate the democratic values which mean so much to us all. On 4th July, the USA will be celebrating Independence Day, and 10 days later, the French will be celebrating Bastille Day with their customary flair. Both of these events are an opportunity to celebrate national identity, but they are also a re-affirmation of the importance of the liberty of the individual. The American and French Revolutions of the 18th



Century were, at least in part, the result of a desire to ensure individual freedoms against infringement by a largely unaccountable State. The main reason that England did not have a Revolution in the 18th century was that it had already had its Revolution back in the previous century, when it had established the constitutional principle that the State must respect the liberty of the individual citizen.

Of course, society will always impose some limits on the liberty of the individual, but within the democratic tradition, it is generally believed that such limits should be very much the exception rather than the rule, and that any limits that are imposed should be kept to the minimum.

The gift of liberty has been celebrated in the Christian tradition, and it has been felt to be important that Christian leaders develop and protect the liberty of those under their rule. There have been arguments over what this "liberty" means in practice, but the principle has been clear.

But the Christian faith has also been clear that the gift of liberty must not be misused. We are given freedom in order to care for others, rather than to oppress them. An early Christian called St Paul wrote the following words to Christians in Galatia: "you were called to freedom, brothers and sisters; only do not use your freedom as an opportunity for self-indulgence, but through love become slaves to one another. For the whole law is summed up in a single commandment: "You shall love your neighbour as yourself."

Liberty is such a precious gift. Many people around the world yearn to enjoy the liberties which we enjoy in our country. But how are we using our precious gift of liberty? Are we using it for the benefit of all, or do we just use it for our own selfish ends?

#### SUSTAINABLE BLEWBURY IS NOW A CHARITY

We have been awarded charitable status by the Charity Commission, and now have a legal status as a **Charitable Incorporated Organisation (CIO**). We are governed by eight Trustees, all of whom have been closely involved in Sustainable Blewbury. The new status means we can own property, for example for our Quaker Wood project, and register land in Sustainable Blewbury's name, claim Gift Aid on donations, and will benefit from more opportunities to raise funds from sources such as trusts and foundations.

One effect of charity status is that the Blewbury Garden Market will have to be separate from Sustainable Blewbury as it allows our producers to make (relatively small) profits.

#### LETTER FROM DAVID JOHNSTON MP

Thank you to everyone who completed my health services survey. In total, 2,838 people did so, 77% of whom said they had had difficulty getting a GP appointment in the last year (44% said they had had difficulty accessing an appointment with a dentist). Unsurprisingly, 97% of people felt we do not have enough GPs for the number of people we have locally and 98% felt we do not have enough dentists. I completely agree and have been banging the drum on our health services since I was elected. Not long after the survey closed, I secured a debate in parliament about our health services and intend to keep banging heads together until we get the services we need. I was pleased to take the Children's Minister, Claire Coutinho, to a local nursery recently to meet staff and children. The Government is making the largest single investment in childcare in history, which will give parents 30 free hours of childcare per week from when their child is nine months old until they start school, which will be very welcome to the parents who raise childcare with me when I knock on their doors. I have launched a childcare survey on my website which is designed to let parents (and grandparents) talk about their experience of accessing childcare and say what they'd like to see. Still on education, I was drawn to ask a question at Prime Minister's Questions and used it to highlight the great news that English primary school children have just been ranked the best readers in the western world – better than all of Europe as well as the USA and Canada – and the fourth best globally. This is in large part testament to teachers and the Government's focus on phonics, which was initially resisted by some but is clearly bearing fruit. Depending on when you read this, you'll either just still have time to attend my 3<sup>rd</sup> Annual Climate Summit for constituents on Zoom on 4 July or it will have happened and you'll be able to watch a recording of it on my website or Facebook page. I was pleased that Grant Shapps, Secretary of State for Energy Security and Net Zero, agreed to give the keynote speech – and, as ever, local and national experts agreed to take part.

This year, I have been hosting at least one local young person for work experience every month including Anastasiia, who is originally from Ukraine. I first met her with the family she is kindly hosted by in North Moreton. It was good to have her with us in Parliament.

I've enjoyed getting into the swing of the summer events happening across the constituency, including the Hagbourne Church Fete and Uffington Fun Day. #### **NATURE NOTES**



Why are so many creatures in nature black and white? Killer Whales to Malyan Tapir, Penguins to Badgers, Pandas to Zebras. The sea is blue, the forest is green, it doesn't seem to make sense! I'm pondering this question at 4:30 in the morning, not due to any existential crisis, but rather working my way through the moth trap in my garden. A species I had not seen for two years has turned up, a Leopard Moth. These are strange, almost primitive moths. Their wings are like sheets of translucent cellophane, their

thorax impossibly furry, dotted with metallic black. The caterpillars bore into wood (such as Cherry or Willow trees) and live inside the tree for up to four years before emerging as adults. When on the wing they have no functioning mouthparts and cannot feed.

Another egg box is turned over as the church clock strikes five. Another black and white moth, again not seen for several years, the Peppered Moth. Larger than the 'Leopard', its wings stretch out. Feathered antenna feverishly scout the air for pheromones. The species is sometimes referred to as Darwin's Moth. This is because the moth was used as a great example of evolution. As industrialisation and pollution increased so our trees became encrusted in soot. This favoured a rare mutation in the Peppered moth, that made the moth dark (*melanic*), rather than light and speckled. Predators soon picked up on this, eating the lighter form whilst the melanic form was supremely camouflaged. In 1848, in Manchester, the first melanic form of Peppered moth was found. By 1895–98% of the species was melanic. Natural selection happens fast! As legislation was brought in so that we could all breath, the reverse happened, and the Peppered Moth returned to its lighter, speckled form.

And so, to answer the question set at the beginning. Camouflage is a big reason for black and white colouring in nature. Zebras at first glance look like they will stand out on the Savanna but when in tall grass they are difficult to see and when moving as a herd very difficult for a Lion to spot an individual. Even biting flies get confused by the contrasting colours. Skunks use their colour scheme as a warning to stay away (*Aposematism*). Penguins have distinct black & white plumage to recognise their young in crowded colonies. Pandas inhabit areas of varying temperatures and both being black & white helps thermal regulation. Despite all our preconceptions nature always has an answer. *Glen Meadows*

#### Stop the fossil fuel industry fooling us!

The unusual weather is making us more aware of how our climate is changing, and the urgency to cut down on the amount of fossil fuels we use. But the fossil fuel industry is working against us. Enormous dividends paid to investors, and enormous influence at conferences meant to reduce climate change.

**COP 26** There was huge publicity about the UK hosting COP 26, but not about Fossil fuels having the largest delegation at the climate summit: 503 delegates, with the largest country delegation, Brazil, only having 479 delegates and the UK only 280. Global Witness, who did the analysis, said "Their influence is one of the biggest reasons why 25 years of UN climate talks have not led to real cuts in global emissions." BBC News, Science and Environment 8 Nov. 2021

**COP 27**: Hosted by Egypt. A rise in the number of fossil fuel industry delegates at the climate summit. Global Witness found that more than 600 people (200 in national delegations) at the talks in Egypt are linked to fossil fuels. *That's more than the combined delegations from the 10 most climate-impacted countries.* BBC News, Science and Environment 10 Nov. 2022.

**COP 28:** Will be hosted by United Arab Emirates in Dubai. A nation that heavily depends on oil and natural gas to support the economy. What can we expect? Read the Guardian's opinion at the time of COP 27 (16 Nov 2022) on the UAE's use of PR to launder its reputation on reducing emissions. <a href="https://bit.ly/3JqrGe5">http://bit.ly/3JqrGe5</a>

#### REMEMBERING THE TOWERS

Each of the months covered by this issue of the Bulletin sees an anniversary of the demolition of the cooling towers of the old Didcot A power station, with the first (southern) three falling on 27 July 2014 and the remaining three on 18 August 2019. To mark the passing of this local landmark, we are reprinting a poem by **Patrick McGuinness** that recently appeared in *The London Review of Books*. We are grateful both to the author and to the *LRB* for their kind permission to reproduce it, and are happy to inform our readers that this is just one among a whole new collection of Patrick's poems entitled *Blood Feather*, published by Jonathan Cape. He is also the author of *Real Oxford*, a book about the city beyond the university, published by Seren.

#### The Cooling Towers of Didcot

It was the inattentive eye that saw them best: breezeblock vases with their tapered waists, their smoky pouts. They were modest,

middle-distant; they had the permanence of grey things: seen but rarely noticed; or, if noticed, only once.

When the dynamite sapped them a ripple climbed their flanks; their mouths were trying to say something difficult.

They hesitated, as if falling was a choice, and when they fell they sleeved their outlines, peeled themselves

off the air that wouldn't quite let them go, that even seemed to try to hold them up. They did their best to leave unnoticed: even now,

though crowds had gathered, the local news, a man who worked there and thought them beautiful, who cried in the same reticent way they fell,

and the developers whose view they'd blocked. Then they crashed silently into smoke and dust followed by their noise which arrived too late.

I miss them, their uninsistent presence: sometimes it felt like they were moving and we were not; from Didcot station's

interzone, they looked serene, brewing clouds in concrete stills; in our connecting-train hypnosis,

they were the ones who seemed to leave, weighed anchors and steamboat chimneys, and we who stayed behind; their smoky sillage seen through a rainy window was part of the commuting consciousness, those small realistic dreams that visit

when we doze in public places; the porous ones that use ingredients from the world around and fold them in

to our brief, matt fantasies of escape: nothing extreme or too destabilising; more like liquid on a not-quite-flat surface,

always edging slightly across its borders but never overspilling. They promised that the ordinary would always quietly

exceed its confines but never break them down. That it was inexhaustible; evergrey plains of everyday things, so many and so much

that you didn't need to look, not now at any rate, because it would always be there.
You could pay attention next time,

and there would always be a next time. So for now you let them slide into the margins of your need to be somewhere,

the burned-off vapour of your hurry in the return journey of water becoming air becoming water.

Now they're gone there's only the pragmatic little station to which they seemed to say:

you have the timetables but we have the time.

The PC is delighted to welcome new councillors Sheila Austin and Andrew Calder. Sheila is a long-time resident of Blewbury who brings a wealth of knowledge gained in running her own catering business. Andrew is recently retired, with long and useful experience in the insurance industry.

Remedial work on the Clubhouse, which was flooded during the winter, should be complete by the end of June. After snagging, cleaning & re-stocking, we hope the building will be open for business again in the middle of July.

The PC would like to remind villagers that it is their responsibility to cut back hedges/trees/plants on their boundaries so that everyone can safely use the footpaths. #### PLANNING APPLICATIONS

#### Responses to the District Council:

P23/V1265/HH Winterbrook Farm, Bessels Way Demolish existing plant room and build new summerhouse. Blewbury PC has no objection.

P23/V1300/HH Charity School House, Church Road Erection of detached, oak-framed home office and reading room following removal of two existing sheds. Blewbury PC has no objection, but asks that the ancillary accommodation proposed remains subordinate to the main house (via planning condition).

P23/V1035/HH Garden House, Westbrook Street Replace all windows with PVCu windows. Addition of new front door with porch and two new windows to north elevation. Stained timber cladding to exterior brickwork to allow for cellotex insulation, and further works to insulate the dwelling. Blewbury PC has no objection.

P23/V1169/FUL Blewbury Service Station, London Road Retrospective application for a proposed 3m rear extension. The PC has no particular objection to this retrospective application, but drew the Vale's attention to the effect on the neighbouring scheme for Ridgeway with the following comment: *This rear extension (already built) will affect the side access and garden of plot 04 of the approved scheme for Ridgeway (P21/V1626/FUL).* 

P23/V1032/FUL Land Adjacent Garden House, Coffin Way Construction of a single detached dwelling. Blewbury PC has no objection to the design of the house, however the site plan as depicted includes a shared access road. The PC objects to the close-boarded fencing proposed between the bungalow and the new house — policy 9 of the village NDP states: Where possible, boundaries should be native or wildlife-enhancing hedgerows. Fencing and walls should reflect traditional rural styles; high fences or walls restricting views are discouraged. The PC is also concerned about the proposed car parking, which will lead to cars exiting the site by reversing across a public footpath.

P23/V0560/HH 85 Dibleys The construction of a two-storey side extension and a single storey rear extension following demolition of conservatory. (Parking arrangements as amended by plan of 18 May 2023.) BPC has no further objection. Enquiries regarding planning in the parish may be sent to blewburypc@gmail.com

Artwork should be in black and white only. You can also send plain text for us to fit into an appropriately sized box. If you are advertising a village event you can also present it as plain editorial, i.e. not highlighted in a box, for no charge.

All advertisements should be submitted to the Editor in the first instance, either emailed to editor@blewbury.co.uk as a Microsoft Word, Microsoft PowerPoint, JPEG or PDF attachment, or typed/handwritten and delivered to Swallows, Church Road, Blewbury OX11 9PY. If your advertisement is accepted, please note that payment must be received before the Bulletin goes to press. If you require repeat insertions over multiple months, the Advertising Manager will make the appropriate arrangements.

We ask for a maximum length of 500 words (closer to 400 if there is an accompanying photo). Anyone supplying information for publication must be responsible for its accuracy.
