We are particularly indebted to them this month, though, for providing the only explanation we've heard for the presence of eight apparently fully armed members of the Home Guard recently spotted wandering around the village! Here is their report:

The late summer weather, whilst very welcome, has somehow detracted from the fact that the clocks go back at the end of the month, and we are heading towards the festive season which is always an enjoyable time for ringing. Thank you Helen and Christine for manning the bell ringing table at the Clubs and Societies day at the Village Hall.

Sunday 15th October saw eight local uniformed Home Guard enthusiasts, complete with full kit and dummy rifles visit St Michael's tower. Some of them apparently had a history of relatives (Lalleys) who were in the Blewbury Home Guard, and they came to remember the volunteers who were positioned on the tower roof to watch for enemy aircraft or fires during the war. If anyone has any photo-



graphs, documents, or memorabilia from the Blewbury Home Guard then they would be delighted to hear from you. It is always lovely to welcome other ringers to Blewbury and equally nice to ring at other towers; we have a mini outing to towers in West Oxfordshire coming soon. 

The Didcot Emergency Foodbank is currently helping an average of 84 families each session due to very high demand – that is almost 650 families every month. If you can give even one item, collection boxes are outside the Charity School House on these dates or at Blewbury Post Office any time. They ask for: -

- Jars of pasta sauces / jam / peanut butter / coffee (small)
- Packets of pasta / rice / packets dried potato / breakfast cereals / biscuits / treats / tea
- Cartons of long-life milk / long-life juice / hot chocolate
- toiletries, toilet rolls, tissues & laundry products, washing up liquid
- Please make sure that all food is within its sell by date.
- Foodbank cannot accept alcohol, razors, medicines, or homemade preserves

Matty's Story

Our godson, Matty Horkan, is passionate about being in nature. In February 2023, in response to the tragic loss of two younger brothers, James and Joe, he started Joe Wild, a charity that helps young people with mental health challenges to reconnect with nature to support their wellbeing. Matty had just started his journey – he climbed Mount Kilimanjaro last year to raise funds, was due to go on a whale-watching tour to mentor young people and was studying conservation at college – but tragically, while volunteering for a conservation charity in Tenerife earlier this year, he suffered a 'complete' spinal cord injury that has left him paralysed. Matty now wants to focus on reconnecting wheelchair users with the outdoors to support their recovery and wellbeing. Matty is an amazing young man and is now at Stoke Mandeville spinal rehabilitation unit, keeping

his vision alive from his hospital bed and facing the immense challenges he now has with such bravery and determination. We are supporting his remarkable parents, Bev and Sean, in raising money to build a place for Matty to live independently and to support his plans and vision for Joe Wild.

Sandy and I would like to thank John and Annabel for kindly supporting this event and to locals who have kindly donated a promise for the auction, we have been blown away by people's kindness here in Blewbury.

BLOWN AWAY IN BLEWBURY?

Blown Away is a new departure for Blewbury author Loraine Fergusson. I had previously really enjoyed her historical wartime fiction A Dangerous Act of Kindness, a fictionalised account of the WW2 German plane crash up on the Downs. This latest book is however a collection of sixteen short stories.

In 2018, having already won the Blackwell's Prize in her MA degree in Creative Writing at Oxford Brookes University, Loraine discovered NYC Midnight, which is an international short story knockout competition for authors, with randomly generated prompts sent out to thousands of writers across the world with a very short time allowed to submit your entries. She has done well in this competition, and, in particular, has loved the feedback she got from the judges. One judge stated "Something that struck me in your writing was how rich your descriptions were, using such varied and original sensory detail. Even



in the first paragraph, you've got the 'warm current', the 'floating flowers' that glint like stars, the bubbling springs – it's stunning, and what's more you maintain it throughout. Great work!" This helped me a great deal to understand why it was that time and again I had been quickly gripped by each of her NYC stories.

None of these short stories are set in Blewbury, but although you can take an author out of Blewbury, it seems that you can't take Blewbury out of the author. One features a drama in a garden centre, which advertises with 'Get your Cabbages from Babbages'. Now where have I heard that one before? Another story involves a local community theatre group, who perform in an amphitheatre in someone's garden, and give the hired in professional director a real runaround, as he tries to exercise his artistic talents in this unfamiliar local amateur dramatics setting. Then we find ourselves in two Oxford University Colleges where murder is attempted in one, and an imported box sold by mistake in an auction at the Pitt Rivers Museum appears to be the source of a malevolent curse in the other. *Blown Away* in Blewbury – well I hope that some of you will read it and enjoy the ride!






Have you heard of Woodbine Willie?

This month, many people will be taking part in services of Remembrance, remembering the names of those who have given their lives for this country, especially in the 1st and 2nd World Wars.

It is now over 100 years since the end of the 1st World War, but somehow this war has managed to etch itself onto the collective memory of our country. The war produced many well-known figures, among them an Army chaplain nicknamed Woodbine Willie. This was a time when probably the majority of men smoked cigarettes, and Woodbine Willie earned his nickname through his habit of distributing Woodbine cigarettes to the troops. His proper name was Geoffrey Anketell Studdert Kennedy. He was born in 1883, and, in addition to his time as a Chaplain to the Forces, he served as the parish priest of two urban parishes: St Paul's Worcester and St.Edmund, Lombard Street, in the City of London.



Woodbine Willie combined warmth of character with a deep faith, and he was able to relate to people from a wide range of backgrounds- hence his great success as an Army chaplain. He wanted to show the relevance of the Christian faith to the ordinary man and woman, as they faced the challenges of everyday life. He communicated his message through preaching, books and poetry. After the War, he worked in association with the Industrial Christian Fellowship, an organisation which tried to present the Christian faith to the world of industry.



Tastes change, and I suspect few if any read Woodbine Willie's writings today. But the heart of his message remains relevant today, especially at this time when we remember the dead of the 1st and 2nd World Wars. Jesus does indeed call Christians to be compassionate: to provide practical help and comfort to all who suffer. But Jesus also calls Christians to address issues relating to social justice: the Kingdom of God isn't just limited to the way we live our lives as individuals, but extends to the way we structure our society as a whole and the way the nations of the world relate to each other on the international stage.

Woodbine Willie knew the pain and complexity of the world as it is. But he was determined to work with others to try and make it a better place. I wonder if we have the courage to follow in his steps?

FROM OUR CANADIAN CORRESPONDENT

I think I can call our recent Apple Day a success! Approximately 50-75 people turned up and there was a wonderful buzz about the whole garden (enhanced by a swarm of wasps attracted to the apples). The new entrance sign made by our local Men's Shed was erected in time, the weather was absolutely splendid, and there was only one casualty requiring First Aid, and I managed to get stung twice by wasps whilst picking up buckets of prepared fruit, but was able to assuage the pain by applying a chewed plantain leaf to the stings, which worked!

In addition to the aforementioned equipment from the Tool Library, we were also able to borrow a scratter (shredder) from another community garden, complete with experienced operator! I left her in charge of a tableful of willing volunteers busily preparing apples, and others cranking the handle on the scratter. The equipment had its shortcomings – it is bulky and had to be lifted onto a table to enable a bucket to be positioned to catch the juice, and we had to slide an extra tray under it to ensure no juice was wasted. However, having sorted out the logistics, many apples were pressed and much juice was bottled and sampled.

Catherine was kept very busy selling her excellent apple chutney, apple cake, glasses of fresh juice, and apple chips made in the dehydrator, which was also demonstrated. Most people had never tasted freshly pressed juice before and were unaware how delicious it was. Visitors were also able to admire a display of the many types of apples being used and taste samples. We raised over \$600 for the Neighbourhood House in sales and donations!

Visitors enjoyed a potluck lunch of mainly apple-themed dishes prepared by volunteers, but unfortunately due to a mixup over dates, our anticipated cider maker was unable to attend; however, we were all so busy nobody missed him!

We are already planning the next Apple Day and debating whether to invest in better equipment. In the meantime, we have two cases of cider awaiting tasting – it might even be drinkable! And my apple cider vinegar is now bottled and maturing. All the waste from the pressing was put in a black compost bin, layered with fallen leaves, and in two weeks has reduced by half and composting nicely! *Angela Hoy (angelahoy23@gmail.com)*





NATURE NOTES

Spider! Thou need'st not run in fear about
To shun my curious eyes,
I won't humanely crush thy bowels out,
Lest thou should'st eat the flies.
Robert Southey 'To a Spider', 1799

Admittedly not everyone's cup of tea, late autumn is the time when we come in to contact the most with spiders. The autumn season is when male spiders go in search of mates and some spiders seek the warmth and shelter of our homes. Arachnophobia is a common condition, with around 75% of the population being uncomfortable with spiders, but, as we will see, in truth there is very little to fear. There are around 660 species of spider in the UK. Of these only about 12 can bite through human skin and only two can cause what can be classed as a painful bite.

The name spider is derived from the Old English word *spinnan*, easily translated to 'spinner'. And whilst most spiders do spin a web not all species do. The tiny Zebra Spider actively pursues it prey. I often watch them on a sunny fence in the garden. First, they wait motionless, monitoring for prey using two pairs of eyes on the side of their head. Once a victim is detected the much larger front-facing eyes help the spider judge the distance it has to jump to get it.

The classic spider found in the bath is, more often than not, one of the three *Tegenaria* species of commonly encountered house spiders. The male often roams at night in search of a female. The females are found inside their funnel shaped webs. After mating she will store the male's sperm overwinter then lay fertilised eggs in the spring. *Tegenaria* also includes the Cardinal Spider (*Tagenaria parietina*), the UK's largest, with some male spiders having 120mm leg span! The Daddy-longlegs Spider (*Pholcus phalangioides*) have very long, thin legs and a grey body. They make a tangled, non-sticky web and when disturbed they can vibrate rapidly, becoming almost a blur. These are the species that gave rise to the myth that they have the most powerful venom in the world but are too weak to bite through human skin. This is of course complete nonsense. Another species steeped in hyperbolic myth is the Noble False Widow Spider (*Steatoda nobilis*), a favourite of tabloid headlines. It does have a more toxic bite than any other native UK spider and it deserves our respect. I have several of them living in my attic quite peacefully. They live almost entirely within the funnel of their web. They are very shy, reclusive creatures. I only really notice them when they discard their prey, normally Wasps or mosquitos which are far more bothersome. Spiders provide this ecosystem service all for free! *Glen Meadows*

The club will be kept informed about developments by email. I was really pleased with how my Pensioners' Fair in Wantage went. Lots of pensioners were able to get information and advice from a wide range of organisations, including Vale Community Impact, Carers Oxfordshire, Thames Valley Police and Grove Day Centre. My thanks again to Driving Miss Daisy in Didcot for sponsoring it.

Last month, I officially opened Soha Housing's new building in Wallingford, Frances Curtis Court. It provides retirement living options and I was very impressed that they had managed to build it on time and on budget despite the pandemic. It was particularly nice that Frances Curtis's Grandson was able to be there for the event, too.

Andy Baker is a local hero in Didcot and I am proud to be a patron of his charity, Play2Give. It was great to be able to be at his 2023 Gatsby Ball last month, a really great event with 140 people in attendance. It celebrated his organisation having now raised more than £100,000 for Oxford Children's Hospital. Well done, Andy!

Two things for you and your families to participate in before next month. I have just launched my annual Christmas Card Competition for primary school children. It's open till the 13th November and entries need to be on an A4 page – the winning design will go on the front of my card! I've also opened a survey asking what you think about the PM's proposal to increase the age you can buy cigarettes by a year every year so that a 14-year-old today is never able to buy one. It's been a very busy first few weeks as Minister for Children, Families and Wellbeing. Green Bin recycling

The Vale is asking residents to 'check it before you chuck it' as part of a drive to increase the amount and quality of recycling in the district. Because of contamination, around 11% of SODC/Vale's yearly green bin contents are rejected for recycling. Please follow these general tips:

- recycling should be clean, dry and loose
- glass jars and food trays should be 100% clean
- food waste, black bags, nappies, textiles, film from the top of plastic trays, plastic bags, plastic pouches (e.g. for pet and baby foods), sweet wrappers and crisp bags wrappers CANNOT be recycled via the Vale's green bins.

Responses to the District Council:

P23/V2066/HH & P23/2067/LB Granary House, London Road Refurbish and convert existing curtilage listed storage outbuilding into an ancillary residential annex for a family member or dependent relative. BPC has no objection, but asks that the proposed ancillary accommodation remains closely associated with – and subordinate to – the main house, in order to avoid future subdivision of this narrow plot on the main road.

P23/V2131/HH Lantern Cottage, South Street Proposed amendments to Planning Permission P22/V1817/HH dated 8 September 2022, and additional new proposals for the replacement of all of the existing single glazed windows with new double glazed upvc windows; replacement of existing door to the Tea Room with new upvc door; raising of the cills of the windows to the Tea Room and bricking up beneath, and insertion of a new Velux conservation rooflight in the existing rear roof. BPC objects to this application as Lantern Cottage is a non-designated heritage asset (NDHA) whose traditional features are part of the historic fabric and character of Blewbury's conservation area. The early C20 shopfront tells the story of this building's social history, and could be repaired and fitted with secondary glazing to improve the building's thermal efficiency. The village NDP also states that upvc is not a suitable replacement material for traditional windows or doors in the conservation area.

P23/V2079/HH & P23/V2046/LB Orchard Dene House, Watts Lane. Rear Extension. BPC has no objection.

DISTRICT COUNCILLOR UPDATE



Hello from Hayleigh and Debra:

This month we had a full council meeting on 11th October (minutes published on the VOWHDC website). Two motions were passed: one regarding the council's ongoing commitment to being a Real Living Wage employer and extending that to employees of third-party contractors, and a second motion committing to tackling period poverty. We are, as a council, working on our Joint Local Plan with South Oxfordshire District Council, which will guide what kinds of new housing and

infrastructure such as leisure facilities, green spaces and transport, are needed and where they should go. It will also outline the ways we can meet our targets to make our part of the county carbon neutral by setting environmental standards for development.

You may have noticed that work has started to prepare the new junction with the A4130 for Valley Park. We understand that Valley Park and its impacts continue to be a concern for residents. As a result, when the planning application for the first parcel of 172 homes was ready for a decision this month, we decided to bring this to planning committee. This means that rather than a planning officer making the decision, a committee of councillors considers the application during a meeting where members of the public and parish councils can raise their concerns. Debra spoke at the meeting on behalf of residents, reminding the committee that, although not in the scope of this application, these homes when first occupied, will lack the infrastructure needed to support them: healthcare, childcare and education, which are massively overstretched. Supporting infrastructure will be provided, as per the Valley Park outline planning permission, but will come later in the development when a certain number of homes are occupied. She also raised other issues residents had expressed concerns about including the noise from the A4130 for the homes closest to it, especially with the potential dualling of the A4130 due to HIF1.

It was good to see that the developers, Persimmon Homes, have made a commitment that each of these homes will have solar panels, air source heat pumps, EV chargers and cycle parking. Planning permission was granted by the committee. The meeting is available to watch on YouTube under South and Vale Committee Meetings.
