
FATHER JASON HONOURED

Our rector, the Revd Jason St John Nicolle, has been made an honorary canon of Christ Church Cathedral. The award, in recognition of distinguished service to the church, was presented during a service in Oxford in January.

Fr Jason was ordained in 2004 and has spent all his time in local ministry. In 2008 he moved to the Churn benefice after his curacy in Kidlington, serving Blewbury and six other neighbouring parishes.

The awards recognise the dedication of lay and ordained people to the Diocese of Oxford and the wider church across a variety of areas of ministry and mission. This includes roles supporting theological education in the worldwide Anglican Communion, the deaf and hard of hearing in the diocese, and community organising and church growth.

Speaking on his installation as honorary canon, Fr Jason said: "It is a great honour. It comes

UPDATE FROM BLEWBURY RESETTLEMENT SUPPORT TEAM

Having spent lots of hours searching for a house to rent in Blewbury, ReST's core group has decided to spend some of our funds to support a refugee family arriving soon in Didcot. A Didcot-based group with similar aims to ReST has found a suitable house and are currently being paired up with a family by the Home Office. While it's disappointing

not to have found a house in Blewbury, ReST hopes everyone who kindly helped us raise funds will be pleased to know we're providing much-needed support to a refugee family close by.

On a separate note, pledges for a new almshouse in Blewbury have reached the magnificent total of £125,000, but we need at least £500,000 to proceed to buy a house in the village for a future family in need. To those who have pledged money – thank you so much for your patience! We will update you on our next steps as soon as we can.

DEDICATION OF BLEWBURY METHODIST CHURCH'S WAR MEMORIAL

On January 21st there was a short dedication service of the Methodist War Memorial under the new lychgate led by our local Methodist minister, Rev. Bruce Thompson. 

Walking along the Cleve to get the weekend papers, a fast, low flash of azure blue and fiery copper orange flashes across the water. It makes for an incongruous contrast to the silty desert of the Cleve, denuded of so much life. However, life there is! As this blur of colour settles and I remain statue-still, the bird lives up to its name and dives into the shallow water. Its reward, a Stickleback.

I generally see Kingfishers in Blewbury during the winter period. The species is territorial, but during the cold weather they move from their breeding areas to find more food. Numbers are also boosted by individuals migrating from the continent. They can suffer high mortality rates during the winter as lakes and ponds freeze over and many a river is in spate.

During March they start to excavate their nests in riverside banks. These can be well over a metre in depth, but only 5cm in diameter. They can lay up to seven eggs over two or three broods, so they have the potential to bounce back from winter population declines. There are thought to be around 4000 breeding pairs in the UK and each bird can live to just over four years, but more typically only two.

Kingfishers, in folklore, have always been associated with weather. There was once a brutal tradition of hanging a dead kingfisher on your door and its beak would point to the wind. Feathers were kept as a charm to ward off thunder. Aristotle believed the kingfisher to nest at sea during the 'halcyon days', a period of calm weather seven days either side of the winter solstice. Alcyone was the daughter of Aelous, the Greek god of wind, and the wife of Ceyx. Zeus, in a jealous rage, which the Greek gods seemed so prone to, whipped up a storm and killed Ceyx. Later, to atone for his rage, Zeus transformed the couple into Halycon birds, the Kingfisher. Every year Aelous would calm the sea to allow the kingfishers to nest.

His star find was a William the Conqueror penny. Our next club night meeting will be about how to sharpen tools, and Mike Magnay will demonstrate a new system for sharpening wood plane irons. Date: Tuesday 12th March 7.30pm. All welcome, you don't need to be a member - come and have a go at sharpening your own tools. You'll get plenty of guidance.

Donation thanks: A big thank you to Jo Lakeland who recently donated her late husband Chris's set of auger bits. These will be in regular use and a nice reminder of Chris, who was a great supporter of BlewShed being established when he was Chair of Blewbury Parish Council.

Outdoor storage space needed: with membership increasing rapidly and materials for Shed projects stocking up, we are in urgent need of somewhere to store things outdoors as the Shed indoor space is very limited. Saint Patrick's Breastplate



I wonder: do you have any plans for 17th March? As you may or may not be aware, 17th March is **St. Patrick's Day.** St. Patrick was British by birth, and was probably born c.390AD. As a young man, he was captured by Irish pirates and enslaved. After some 6 years In Ireland as a slave, he escaped (or was freed), and returned to his family. He then trained to be a priest, and decided to go back to Ireland, but this time as a missionary. Patrick established a base at Armagh, and he seems to have focussed his missionary work in the north of Ireland. The date of his death is uncertain, but it was probably sometime in the 460s AD. Some of Patrick's writings have survived, including a short autobiography.

In subsequent centuries, Patrick's fame spread far and wide, and in due course he became regarded as the patron saint of Ireland. Lots of stories were told about him, which may or may not have any foundation in fact. For example, one story claimed that Patrick expelled all the snakes from Ireland, and another story has Patrick explaining the theology of Trinity by pointing to a shamrock.

There is a wonderful ancient Irish poem called St. Patrick's Breastplate, which is popularly attributed to St. Patrick. This poem has been turned into a hymn, which starts "I bind unto myself today the strong name of the Trinity". If you are unfamiliar with the hymn, do look it up. It is sung to a splendid traditional Irish melody – in fact, two different Irish melodies, as two verses in the hymn are sung to a different tune.

St. Patrick's hymn is unlike any other – and whether or not it goes back to the Saint himself, the words are quite remarkable. So remarkable, in fact, that some might question whether they should be sung in church! Eric Routley, who wrote extensively on hymns, considered the hymn to be a "very primitive blending of supernatural and natural experience"; and others have written that the hymn contains "many elements of druidical incantation mingled with a war-song and a creed". I wonder what you think? Is the hymn suitable or not?

If you are curious to learn more, do come along to St Andrews's East Hagbourne at 10.30am on Sunday 17th March. You'll be most welcome. We're holding a special service to celebrate St Patrick and there will be the chance to sing his hymn!



LETTER FROM DAVID JOHNSTON MP

One of the most common questions I'm asked is what is life like as an MP.

In general my week is split Monday-Thursday in Parliament and Friday-Sunday back home in Didcot. At the time of writing this, the last week kicked off with a team meeting at the Department for Education, followed by my weekly meeting with the team delivering our huge expansion of childcare, with the first 15 hours of free childcare becoming available for working parents from April. Alongside various other meetings, Chilton County Primary School came for a visit to Westminster, and it was great to meet them and take their questions.

Tuesday included meeting with GARD to discuss the next steps following me echoing their call for a public inquiry of the reservoir proposal in December; attending a networking event of charities and businesses involved in our Disability Action Plan; and responding for the Government in a debate about nursery provision in the South West. Just as MPs like myself have regular surgeries with constituents, so Ministers have regular surgeries with MPs to discuss problems they're having locally in areas the Minister covers and Wednesday kicked off with one of these. After attending PMQs, I presented to Parliament my petition to reopen Grove Station, which I'm grateful to the 2127 of you for signing. I met my Parliamentary team before taking another debate - this time on special educational needs - and several other meetings.

Last week was National Apprenticeship Week and on Thursday I visited childcare apprentices and then another nursery. To and from the visits I had calls with 10 local authorities and did some paperwork. Then on Friday I began with a Q&A at Didcot Sixth Form then met with Liane and Mark from Active Future South Oxfordshire and visited apprentices at Williams Racing in Grove. I had several surgery appointments, including meeting a local subpostmaster who contacted me after seeing the ITV drama about the Horizon scandal having recognised that what happened had also happened to her. I am pleased this Government is taking such decisive action to right this wrong. I met with Niamh Dernie from Wantage to talk about the next steps in her campaign against sexual harassment and then had the pleasure of presenting Mikayla Beames from Team Mikayla, which I am a proud patron of, with her Points of Light award from the PM. Then I rounded off the day with my weekly visit to Merv, as part of my volunteering with the Didcot Good Neighbours Scheme.

Weekends are always a combination of door knocking, emails and paperwork for both MP and Minister roles and - when I can manage it - Liverpool games!

I love the ability to make a difference in the job and the variety - as I always say to people, it's better to be busy than bored. As ever, if I can help with anything then do, please get in touch via david.johnston.mp@parliament.uk

BLEWBURY SCHOOL SPORTS REPORT

Pokémon Primary Football Cup Final by beating Whitchurch School in a home game two weeks earlier. In the Final we were to play two other teams (St. Michael's and St. John Fisher). Our first game was against St. John Fisher and we drew 1-1. Then we played St. Michael's and once again we also drew 1-1. After that St. Michael's and St. John Fisher had a game and the score was 2-0 to St. John Fisher. So we then played St. John Fisher in the actual Final. The end score was 2-1 to St. John Fisher. It was a hard game, and we came so close. We each got a medal after the Final for coming second, and we all felt happy and proud. Finally we would also like to thank SCS Oxon Ltd for sponsoring our football kit this season." *Edward & Elliott*

As well as playing in regional competitions the School is also part of local primary school leagues for both the boys and girls team. In those we have recently played Whitchurch, Harwell, and Sutton Courtenay.

HONEST JOHN: MORE TALES FROM THE MILITARY

As a Royal Artillery Surveyor with 50 Missile Regiment in 1960, my job was to survey the position of the Rocket launcher and the target, which could be up to 50 miles away. By calculating the co-ordinates of the launcher and the target I was able to calculate the bearing and time of flight of the missile. My skills were soon put to the test when it was decided to have the first live firing of the Honest John rocket in the UK at Larkhill's artillery range on Salisbury plain. This firing would be attended by senior officers from the artillery regiments of the NATO countries. We had to get the launch correct because the range was only five miles long and that was the minimum flight range of the rocket. If it overshot the target it could land in the middle of Devizes, a small market town.

So on November 9th 1960 four days after Bonfire Night we had our own fireworks display. I was in the computing centre inside an armoured troop carrier called a Saracen. We were parked up in the woods with the rocket launcher heavily camouflaged about fifty yards away. The rocket was timed to be fired at 16:20 hours. I and my colleague John Parfitt independently calculated the figures on our mechanical calculators from data supplied by the surveyors on the ranges. We then issued the Bearing Picket card for the officer in charge to sign and take responsibility for what we had calculated. Poor chap, he was a young artillery officer doing his national service who had taken a basic survey course and he didn't have a clue. He was heavily reliant on his NCOs to make sure everything ran smoothly. He quipped to me, "Warn, if it all goes pear-shaped don't expect to go on a week-end pass. You'll be joining me in the Tower of London." I replied, "No problem Sir! All the figures check out and all systems are in place. Good luck."

The firing crew accepted the Bearing Picket card and from the information on the card set the launcher to the right angle for firing and on the correct bearing. At precisely 16:20 the rocket was fired and seconds later we saw a bright flash as the dummy warhead exploded in the air about 100 feet above the target. All nuclear war heads are designed to explode above the ground.

There was an anxious wait of thirty minutes while the three survey pairs who had observed the flight with their theodolites calculated by Intersection the precise position of the burst. The results showed that the missile was bang on target. The young officer came up to me and thanked me for a job well done. *Pat Warn*

Other signs of Spring are that the local coyotes are breeding, with the accompanying warnings to keep cats in at night if you don't want them to be a meal for a hungry mother coyote and her cubs. However, this doesn't seem to bother the large flocks of Canada Geese who are currently fertilizing the cemetery grass with their droppings.

Another feature of almost—Spring is the appearance of the Vancouver Home and Garden Show at BC Place (where important sporting and music events are staged). This year Vancouver Master Gardeners invited me to talk about my favourite subject (you guessed it, composting!) on the Gardening Education Stage. My slot was immediately after our local celebrity gardener Brian Minter, who had to pause his talk while the very loudspeaker announced me as the next speaker ten minutes before the end of his talk! My audience was much smaller than his, but they were very keen! It's not quite Earls Court, but it spans four days and is well attended by the locals.

And this week I have my first gardening job of the year (a little gentle weeding and tidying), so hopefully the shoulder I dislocated in December will stand up to the strain.

In other news, Canada is introducing a scheme called Pharmacare that will enable older people to obtain free prescriptions, which at the moment cost a lot of money. However, to be eligible for this, I will have to submit a tax return, which is rather amusing at my age. As in the UK, dental care is also very expensive, and a similar scheme is hopefully being introduced, so I hope I will qualify. **Angela Hoy** (angelahoy23@gmail.com)

The PC continues to be concerned by cars parking along the eastern edges of the Pound. We have agreed to plant a low hedge on the corner of South Street and London Road in order to stop cars from parking on this dangerous corner. Visitors to the Blueberry (and anyone else eroding the verges of the Pound by parking any part of their car on the grass) are reminded that this land is a village green space, and should not be used for parking.

PLANNING APPLICATIONS

Responses to the District Council:

P24/V0249/PIP Adjacent to Upperton, Pilgrim's Way Permission in principle for residential development on the site. BPC objects on the basis of P1 of the NDP, which permits residential development within the built area of Blewbury. According to this policy the built area does not include agricultural buildings and associated land on the edge of the settlement. The south side of Pilgrim's Way is overwhelmingly rural in character, with important views of the downland which is a key characteristic of the AONB. The houses immediately to the south and east of this small proposed plot were developed in 2015, a year before the NDP was made, when this policy did not apply.

P24/V0217/HH Collis Moor, Nottingham Fee Demolition of existing annexe. Erection of new single storey side extension. BPC has no objection.

Decisions from the District Council:

P23/V2746/HH 33 Bridus Mead Single storey side and rear extensions. Granted.

P23/V2653/HH 1 Bohams Cottages, Westbrook Street Single storey rear extension to replace existing, and alteration to parking area. Granted.

P23/V2635/FUL Land at the end of Coffin Way Construction of a single dwelling and associated external works. Refused. Enquiries regarding planning in the parish may be sent to blewburypc@gmail.com
