Now the Green Blade Riseth

What a joy it is to see the signs of Spring all around us! The blossom, the birdsong, the new growth all around. We are fortunate indeed to live in such a beautiful area of the country.

For Christians, the celebration of Easter is above all the celebration of new life. We think of Jesus' death on the Cross, commemorated on Good Friday, and his Resurrection to new life on Easter morning. The flowers and greenery which decorate churches at this time of year provide a beautiful visual reminder that Eastertide is all about new life.



A few days or so before Jesus was arrested and then crucified, he spoke the following words to his followers:

"Very truly, I tell you, unless a grain of wheat falls into the earth and dies, it remains just a single grain; but if it dies, it bears much fruit." (John's Gospel Chapter 12, verse 24).

Many Easter hymns pick up this theme of new life. One of my favourite is the hymn which starts "Now the green blade riseth from the buried grain". Perhaps you now the hymn. It was written by J.M.C. Crum, a Church of England priest, and was first published in 1928. It is usually sung to an old French tune known as "Noel Nouvelet".

If you have a chance, do listen to a recording of this hymn. The combination of words and music does a marvellous job of communicating something of the joy of Spring, and also the hopefulness which is at the heart of the Christian festival of Easter. Yes, Jesus died; but Jesus rose again, and is alive today! So let me finish by quoting these words from the hymn:

"Forth he came at Easter, like the risen grain, He that for three days in the grave had lain, Quick from the dead, my risen Lord is seen: Love is come again, Like wheat that springeth green."

My prayer for us all is that during this Easter season we will experience once again God's gift of new life – that we will see new beginnings all around us and have a real sense of hope for the future.

FROM OUR CANADIAN CORRESPONDENT

There's a fascinating little leaflet that's being distributed here by the Invasive Species Council of BC that lists 28 of the most unwanted horticultural plants that grow here, along with recommended alternatives. I fear that British horticulturalists are largely to blame for a lot of these, some of which will surprise you.

English Ivy (as it is called here) *Hedera helix*, is at the top of the list for its alleged tree killing and ground smothering properties, and it is ripped out whenever we find it, despite its yellow blossom being a useful snack for hungry insects when there is not a lot else around, as well as providing a home for useful over-wintering insect predators. There's a lot of conflicting advice on the Internet about it too, but *Salal* is our local alternative, a hardy low-growing bush that's also great in flower arrangements. Buddleia, an untidy shrubby tree is alleged to be a favourite of butterflies, which spreads like wildfire in the most inhospitable of places; recommended alternatives are *Philadelphus* (Mock Orange, which also smells delicious) or the flowering currant *Ribes sanguineum*.

English Holly is another shrub or tree that seems to pop up everywhere as its berries are consumed by birds and subsequently emerge as new plants (prickly to deal with!). A useful alternative (and native to our West Coast) is Oregon Grape (*Berberis aquifolium*), still prickly but with attractive blue berries. Common Comfrey is also on the list, which is a blow to me because of its wonderful use as a compost activator on account of its high nitrogen content, so I shall continue to grow it but just not let it go to seed. Nettles are similarly useful, and Borage, they just need to be kept under control.

The beautiful Yellow Flag Iris is not to be grown either; instead we should choose the Virginia Iris or the Oregon Iris (both purple). Obviously there are the usual suspects that we don't want in our gardens at any price, such as Himalayan Balsam, Knotweed, Purple Loosestrife and a lot of the Spurges (which have nasty sap), but some unexpected additions are Periwinkle (*Vinca minor*) which forms dense mats and crowds out other groundcover plants, Foxgloves, Oxeye Daisies and Bachelors Buttons (aka Corflower) – where would our wildflower meadows be without these, I wonder? And Baby's Breath, beloved by florists for its frothy addition to bouquets, is also disliked; the recommended alternative, *Achillea millefolium*, does not have the same ethereal appearance. Waterlilies are on the list, because they interfere with oxygenation in the water and can block too much light on ponds, which in extreme cases can cause flooding. LETTER FROM DAVID JOHNSTON MP

Being an MP involves a lot of travel across the length and breadth of my constituency from my home in Didcot and this means I know first-hand that the state of the roads across our area is not good enough. I launched my Roads Survey last year and I'm grateful to the almost 900 people who have filled it in. More than 80% of residents agreed that our roads are poor quality. Flooding on the A417 and safety issues on the A420 and A34 were frequently mentioned, and many people spoke about issues with congestion. I am meeting with the Roads Minister to share the findings with him. From potholes to congestion to flooding and safety issues, it is clear that we need improvements. We do not need blanket 20mph zones across our area – and the Government is rightly making clear that these should be decided on a hyper-local basis with local consent. No-one objects to strict limits in areas near schools or other sensitive areas but are they required across an entire town? Constituents regularly say no and 71% of residents who filled in my Roads Survey agreed with the Government's policies here. I have been taking action since I was elected and have raised every issue that has been reported to me with the County Council and the Highways Authorities, who are responsible for our roads. This has resulted in some issues being fixed but I think everyone can agree that it should not take an MP writing a letter for this to happen. I have spoken about the need to improve our local roads in 13 separate debates, met with the Roads Minister about it, and led a debate in Parliament on safety issues on the A34 and A420. It's not all about money, but the Government has also rightly given the County Council millions in funding to help improve our roads and fix our potholes - including a substantial increase of 30% for 2023/24. We need to see this used effectively. I will keep campaigning on this, but please fill in my Roads Survey at www.david-johnston.org.uk/RoadsSurvey.

In other news, Didcot Powerhouse Fund celebrated their two-year anniversary, and I was pleased to attend the launch of their new Impact Report and meet some of the local people who have received funding from them – including great organisations like the Cornermen in South Moreton.

I also took senior managers from the Environment Agency to Steventon to talk about our flood defences and what more can be done to prevent the flooding we have seen. Many constituents shared their thoughts with me ahead of this and I raised various issues on their behalf, including concerns about the proposed reservoir. I will remain in close contact with the Environment Agency and the Council.

Other highlights in recent weeks have included visiting Willowcroft School in Didcot, Williams Racing in Grove, the Happiness Horse Box in Uffington, and Quantum Detectors in Harwell as well as holding a Pop-Up Surgery at Tesco in Didcot. 

RUNNING FOR THE REGIMENT: MORE TALES FROM THE MILITARY

It is 1961 and I am now 18 years old. I have been posted to West Germany as part of the British Army of the Rhine (BAOR), which then comprised 4 Armoured Divisions with a total strength of 50,000 military personnel. I settle in and become a member of my regiment's athletics team, competing in the mile and three mile races. We spend weeks training for the BAOR Athletics Championships in West Berlin.

On the 11th August our team set off for this event, catching the military train to West Berlin at Hanover. The journey is about 155 miles but will take four to five hours, as the train will be travelling through East Germany. We are not allowed to look out at the passing countryside because blinds on the carriage windows have to be kept down while we are travelling through enemy territory. There are armed guards on the train in case of any trouble but the officer in charge would have to get permission from the train commander to fire back if the train was attacked by the East Germans. However the journey is uneventful and we arrive in the British Zone in West Berlin six hours later.

We have been billeted in the Olympic Stadium where the 1936 Olympic Games were held. This is the infamous Games where Adolf Hitler boasted that the Aryan people were supreme in sports. His words rang hollow when Jesse Owens won gold in the 100 and 200 metres, the 4x100 metres relay and the long jump. Hitler refused to shake hands or hand out the medals to the athlete.

The next day, August 12th, we go into the city. British soldiers are allowed to travel in the Russian Zone but we decide best not to go in case the East Germans and Russians thought we could be spying and arrest us. Anyway East Berlin is very drab and still bears the scars of the damage done by the Russian Army in May 1945. During the night the East German Government without any warning decides to close all crossing points from East to West Berlin. At first barbed wire fencing is placed in position, to be quickly followed by a concrete block wall. This would eventually measure 155 kilometres long (96 miles) and 4 metres high (13 foot) and would remain in place till November 1989.

Despite all this the army championships are held over three days and I am picked to represent the regiment in the 5000 metres. However I do not perform well, finishing ninth in the final. In fact I'm lapped by the winner, a soldier called Ernie Pomfret, who went on to represent Great Britain in the 1964 Tokyo Olympics. However the regiment performs well as a team, coming third of the twenty regiments that competed.

When the championships are over, we travel back on the military train to Hanover without any trouble from the East German army as we pass through the various checkpoints. *Pat Warn*

NATURE NOTES

In Blewbury we are all familiar with the streams that frequent our village. The gin-clear water and gentle babbling nature of the Mill Brook meanders past our homes and open spaces. And like most rivers you can see it, touch it, splash about in it, if so inclined. However, there is also a mysterious sub-set of rivers that are underground, lost to our senses. Probably the most famous of the UK's 'lost rivers' are found in London; Fleet Street, once famous for its newspapers (and Sweeny Todd!), is entirely built over the River Fleet. The river was used extensively by the Romans and Anglo Saxons. But as it became more polluted and boat traffic declined it was slowly built over, starting in the 1730s and ending in complete obscurity in the 1870s. Blewbury has its own lost, subterranean river, found (the clue is in the name!) along Westbrook Street.

Over the past few months the old West Brook has re-appeared from underground and spilt out on to the road. But what has caused this to happen? Blewbury lies along the spring line of a great chalk aquifer on the Wessex Downs. The water in our village streams derives from this underground store of water. February 2024 was the wettest on record, with 281% of the long-term average rainfall. Soil moisture deficits (a measure of how much water the soil can hold) were at 0mm, meaning there was no space in the earth for the water to go. This has led to exceptionally high groundwater levels within the productive strata of the chalk aquifer. Not only have forgotten streams reappeared, but the groundwater has infiltrated and overloaded the aging sewage system of the village, with devastating consequences for those impacted by raw sewage entering their properties and gardens.

Although groundwaters, by their very nature, are deep underground, they are not devoid of life. In fact, far from it! A plethora of Crustaceans, Copepods and water mites, amongst many other species, can be found hundreds of metres underground. These fall under the term 'Stygobites', the name being derived from the ancient underground River Styx that marked the boundary between the living and the dead. Charon, the ferryman, would take the souls across to Hades. Stygobites fit perfectly in this surreal underworld. Through evolution they have no need to see in the utter darkness of the deep and have lost the use of their eyes. They are often ghostly pale, almost translucent. In the cramped space deep underground, many species have become elongated as they feed upon sparse microbial biofilms in the crevices below. *Glen Meadows*

Notes of Blewbury Parish Council's meeting: 7pm, Wednesday 6 March 2024, Melland Room, Blewbury Clubhouse.

Present: Dermot Mathias (chair), Andrew Calder, Jane Gibson, Anne Millman, Lee Robinson, Julia Saunders and Mark Shayler. Also present Elizabeth Cooper (clerk), David Hollick (lengthman) and district councillor Hayleigh Gascoigne. Apologies were received from Lydia Inglis, Sheila Austin and county councillor Sally Povolotsky.

Jane Gibson has resigned from the PC after kindly stepping up again last year following an unexpected exodus of councillors. We are very lucky to have benefited from her knowledge and hard work for a while longer than she would have liked...! The PC is hugely grateful for all her years of hard work on behalf of the residents of Blewbury. The zip wire at Ticker's Folly Field cannot be fixed until we have a longer period of better weather – this will be completed as soon as possible. Speed indicator devices (SIDs) to help tackle the persistent problem of speeding on both London Road and Bessels Way should be put up onto their metal poles over the coming 4-6 weeks.

MW.0166/23 (P22/V1914/CM) Chilton Recycling Facility, Chilton OX11 OST. Variation of condition 5 to allow limited HGV movements outside of permitted hours and days of operation for HGV movements. BPC has no objection.

P24/V0533/HH Lowmans, South Street. Rear extension, internal alterations, new rooflights, external wall materials changed. BPC has no objection.

P24/V0610/LB The Cleeve, South Street. Various works to exterior and interior including removal of spray foam insulation from main roof structure and replacement of roof covering, removal of impervious materials, insulation upgrades, replacement of rainwater goods and redecoration of exterior. Various minor changes to interior to enhance breathability, ventilation and removal of late C20th additions to fireplaces. BPC has no objection.

P24/V0405/FUL Open space in village centre called the Playclose, Blewbury. Community artwork sculpture made of stainless steel and Corten steel, with a Corten steel base. This is an application made by the PC, in agreement with the PCC (the owner of the Playclose), so no comment can be submitted by BPC.

P24/V0350/LB Corrydon House, London Road. Various works to whole house (external & internal) including sensitive removal of impervious materials, structural repairs, joinery refurbishment, insulation upgrade, replace rainwater goods & decoration. BPC has no objection.

P24/V0384/S73 Ashbrook House, Westbrook Street. Variation of condition 9 (wildlife protection) & 10 (Ecology) on application P23/V1825/HH – amended impact plan & certificate. BPC has no objection.
