BLEWBURY CRICKET CLUB - NEW MEMBERS AND SUPPORTERS WELCOME

As we (hopefully) start to bid adieu to a long, wet winter and the daffodils start swaying in the spring breeze, attention drifts to warmer months and the bucolic sound of leather on willow. Blewbury Cricket Club is always looking for new members and passionate supporters. We market ourselves as a club for all ages and abilities with everyone welcome. Since Covid lockdown where outdoor sports were permitted, we have seen somewhat of a renaissance of cricket in the village. We are a club of about 50 members with fixtures taking place from mid-May to the end of August. We tend to host three different types of matches throughout the season. Midweek games are generally 20 overs and played against local opposition or indeed scratch teams.



They start at 6pm and are normally finished by 9pm; they tend to take place on Tuesday and sometimes Wednesday and Thursdays. On Fridays we have an interclub turn-up-and-play match with two teams (The Badgers and The Roosters) playing a T20 against each other. These are fun for all the family with a well stocked bar and non-cricketers watching or indeed playing around the outfield. Finally we hold a few Sunday 40-over games against local opposition for those who like to take their cricket slightly more seriously. There is a pay bar at the ground and changing/toilet facilities. Thanks to the invaluable support of BlewShed we have had our gang mowers serviced which will no doubt improve the quality of the outfield. In addition this season a local team called The Berkshire Royals will be using our pitch every Saturday and may well be looking for some eager cricketers to play for one of their teams. 

An Old Tradition Revived

Have you ever heard of the Rogation Days? These are the special name given to the three weekdays before Ascension Day. Ascension Day is always observed 40 days after Easter day, and so this year the Rogation Days fall on Monday 6th May, Tuesday 7th and Wednesday 8th.

You may well be wondering: what are the Rogation Days? They are days specially set aside for prayer (the English word Rogation comes from the Latin word, rogare, which means "to ask"). On these days, we ask God's blessing on the world around us. In the old days, the emphasis was very much on asking God's blessing on the crops growing in the fields, and there was often a tradition of going on a procession around the fields. This seems to be the origin of the tradition of "beating the bounds" of a parish. Nowadays, the scope of Rogation has been widened to include prayer for the world of work more generally, as well as prayer for local communities.



In England, Rogation processions were supressed at the Reformation, and the tradition of observing Rogation seems to have gradually died away. However, in the last thirty or forty years or so, there has been a revival of the tradition, at least some villages and communities. Locally, the tradition is observed at South Moreton. The 10.30am service at South Moreton on Sunday 12th May will take the form of a Rogation procession, and everyone is most welcome to come along and join in.

The idea of a procession to ask God's favour to protect the crops growing in the fields goes back long before Christianity. Despite its origins in ancient beliefs, I think it still has a place today, even in this age of scientific agriculture. It reminds us that all of us are still dependent for our food on the men and women who grow our crops and look after our farm animals. And now that so many of us no longer work on the land, it is good that the tradition has been expanded to include prayer for the world of work in all its diversity. The world of work, both paid and unpaid, plays such an important role in our lives. It is good to have the opportunity to ask God's blessing upon it. It recognises the fact that God cares for the whole of our lives- not just for what we might or might not do on a Sunday.



THE BEATLES, DAVE STEVENS AND ME - MORE TALES FROM THE MILITARY

The year is 1963 and I am still in Y Survey Troop which is now part of 21 Survey Regiment Royal Artillery stationed at Fallingbostel, a garrison town in West Germany. One day a member of the troop told me he was going to start a rock and roll band with three other soldiers and they would like me to be their manager. He said this was because I could converse and make myself understood in German, which I was taught at my grammar school, and I also had the army qualification for colloquial German. But I suspect another reason was because I drove a large German car, an Opel Kapitan, which seated six people and was ideal for carrying the band's drum kit, guitars and sound system. The name of the group was The Rocking Squaddies, with Dave Stevens on vocals and lead guitar, Jock Urquhart also on guitar, Stan Beck on bass guitar and Scouse Darkes on drums.

After agreeing to be their manager I started looking for gigs for the band. It was common in Germany that their equivalent of our public house, the *gasthaus*, always had live music at week-ends. These were the venues I approached, saying we were a group from Liverpool touring Germany. In 1963 German pop music fans knew all about the groups coming from Liverpool and the Merseyside area such as Gerry and the Pacemakers, Brian Poole and the Tremolos, the Searchers and other groups, so the *gasthaus* management signed us up immediately. I would agree a fee for five hours, playing from seven in the evening till midnight. This payment was always in cash and ranged from 200 to 250 deutschmarks. In 1963 225dm was about £20, equal to £337.50 in today's money. Shared equally between the five of us it came to the equivalent of £67.50 each for a night's session. On top of the fee, I negotiated rooms for us to put our heads down after the music finished and free drinks all night for the band and myself. All through the summer of 1963 I arranged gigs around Hannover, Celle Fallingbostel and Hamburg.

When I was not ferrying the band around to gigs, a group of us would go to the Reeperbahn area of Hamburg most week-ends when not on duty to see the American rock'n'roll stars performing in two night clubs, the Star Club and the Top Ten Club. In the clubs I saw at least a dozen American stars perform including my favourites, Little Richard, Jerry Lee Lewis, Fats Domino and Johnny and the Hurricanes amongst others. Also over twenty British acts appeared at the two clubs in the sixties. I remember watching the Beatles in December 1962 at the Top Ten Club. They were just celebrating their first UK hit *Love Me Do* that autumn.

All this came to an end when I crashed the car in November 1963, and I will give details of that crash in my next instalment! *Pat Warn*



LETTER FROM DAVID JOHNSTON MP

Along with the other Conservative MPs in Oxfordshire, I wrote to the CEO of Thames Water to demand that more action is taken to tackle sewage pollution in our waters, and have secured a meeting with him. The Government has taken decisive action to address the sewage issue, including putting in place the strictest ever legally binding targets, which I was proud to vote for; increasing the monitoring of sewage discharges in England to 100% (up from 7% in 2010 under Labour); ensuring fines against water companies are unlimited; and requiring Thames Water and other water companies to deliver the largest ever infrastructure investment of £56 billion to fix this problem. However, people are rightly very angry about this issue, as am I, and I expect Thames Water to act with far greater urgency - which I will make clear during my meeting with the CEO.

I met with the new Chief Superintendent of Thames Valley Police for Oxfordshire and discussed local policing and my campaign to tackle anti-social behaviour, which I know is a huge concern for local people. Thames Valley Police has now recruited 784 more police officers since 2019 (which has meant more officers overall than ever before) thanks to extra Government funding and tackling this should be a priority for them.

I met with the Roads Minister to discuss my campaign to improve our roads and the results of my Local Roads Survey. The Government has given Oxfordshire County Council millions of extra pounds (a 30% funding increase this year) to improve our roads and fix our potholes. We discussed how they should use this money effectively, including filling potholes correctly and not in a way that means they reappear within weeks, as we all know often happens on our local roads.

Autism Family Support Oxfordshire provides vital support to parents across my constituency. Local families wrote to me after Oxfordshire County Council announced they were going to cut their funding which would have had a huge impact. I wrote to them on behalf of all my constituents who rely on this vital service and was glad to hear that the Council have (finally) listened and reversed their funding cut which will be a relief to many families.

I am hosting a fair for families of children and young people with special educational needs. It will take place on Tuesday 28 May at Didcot Civic Hall from 12:30pm to 4:30pm and will be attended by various local and national organisations who help SEND families. Please register on my website at www.david-johnston.org.uk/SEND if you plan to attend. I look forward to seeing you there!

Visits this past month included to Drayton Community Primary School to present Local Hero Awards to four pupils who secured help for an unconscious woman and meeting Kathleen Law in Wantage, at the invitation of her son David, to wish her a happy 100th birthday.

FROM OUR CANADIAN CORRESPONDENT

This year has seen an increased interest in my favourite subject, composting, which has resulted in my giving four talks in as many weeks! First, our Vancouver Master Gardeners held an intensive pruning and composting workshop at the Riley Park Community Garden (where I volunteer), which enabled me to get all three bins turned in record time with minimal effort. Second was a combined Composting and Soil talk with my friend Art, a retired Soil Scientist from the University of British Columbia, and our go-to soil expert, attended by a very knowledgeable and enthusiastic group. Third, one of our Neighbourhood Houses asked me to talk to their (very elderly) Seniors Lunch Group, and it dawned on me halfway through that most of them wouldn't have gardens anymore, let alone compost bins. Still, they were very pleasant and I got a free lunch, as well as the opportunity to take part in their Tai Chi session! Finally, last week I was invited to go and speak to the Victoria Horticultural Society on Vancouver Island about home composting; they have their very own Compost Education Centre on the Island but were not available on a Tuesday (the regular meeting night) so another Master Gardener colleague asked me if I could step in. The trip involved an hour's drive to the ferry terminal, an hour and a half journey across the sea to Swarz Bay and then another hour's drive to the capital of BC, Victoria. In addition to my regular speaker's fee, the Society kindly covered my evening meal, overnight hotel stay and breakfast the following morning! I did, however, get a free trip on the ferry, being a BC Senior (mid-week concession). The Society was founded over a 100 years ago and holds its meetings in a large hall, which is just as well as they have over 400 members. In addition to the main event (me!), there was a plant sale, a flower arranging competition, a seed swap and gardening book swap, as well as a presentation by an alpine garden specialist. Drinks and snacks were also provided. My talk went down very well, with lots of questions (always a good sign), after which I was taken back to my hotel. The following morning my friend and I visited the Compost Education Centre, which was so impressive! Apart from the wide range of equipment for sale to gardeners and informative displays (Mason Bees and Worm composting to mention only a couple) in the surrounding garden, there was a rack of leaflets on twenty different associated gardening subjects. I went back to Vancouver on the ferry, happy in the knowledge that Vancouver Island was well looked after in the composting area! Angela Hoy (angelahoy23@gmail.com)

Blewbury's new Shakespeare group is going from strength to strength! There are now over 50 members on the mailing list, and we already have two 'Shakespeare for Beginners' sessions under our belt. By the time you read this, we will have celebrated the great man's birthday at a sackfuelled party, and at our next event (date tbc) our very own professional actor/director Catie Flye,

will be conduct a mini-masterclass focusing on Act 2 Scene 2 of *Twelfth Night*, and in particular the 'ring' speech spoken by Viola at the end of that scene. Catie will show how a couple of dozen lines can advance the plot, build the character and develop some of the themes of the play. She will also share some 'tricks of the trade' that can be deployed to engage the audience and maximise the impact of Shakespeare's words. I have no doubt that this will be a great introduction to the art of staging these 400-year-old plays, as well as an ideal 'teaser' to *Twelfth Night* itself, which we can then develop by watching the Trevor Nunn film and perhaps conducting our own group reading of the play in the near future.

Looking further forward, we are in talks with a world-renowned Shakespeare scholar to give a talk to the group sometime in the autumn, and just under 30 of us are booked in for a group outing in September to see the RSC's *Pericles* at Stratford. NATURE NOTES – BLACK POPLAR

We are very fortunate in Blewbury to have many fine examples of one of Britain's rarest timber trees, the Black Poplar (*Populus nigra* var. *betulifolia*). These can be found in a few gardens in the village as well as the gnarled stump on the island in the Cleve. They are invariably associated with water and are in fact known vernacularly as the Water Poplar. On a walk along the concrete track in the springtime you will see the orange, red glow of the male catkins, delineating the hedgerows. At the end of the track several excellent specimens of the species can be observed. A large limb that fell in a past storm is now used as a seat next to the nature reserve.

The tree is of much value to wildlife and man. Moths such as the Figure of Eight, the rare Clifden Nonpareil, Hornet and Leopard Moth make it their home. The catkins are a great spring source of nectar for bees. For man, the species is renowned for its fire resistance and was often used as floorboarding. The light, spongy fibres of the wood made it good for clogs, matches (it can absorb paraffin) clothes pegs, wagon bottoms, brake blocks and cartwheels!

These are imposing organisms. Uncurtailed they can reach 100 feet in height. Due to their size and height, they were often planted as 'marker' trees on field boundaries. Black Poplars have rough, fissured trunks and are often dotted with burrs and bosses. Their sweeping limbs often curl and head back down to earth. There leaves are a bright green and heart shaped, and if crushed have the faint scent of balsam. As mentioned, they are dioecious, meaning they have male and female trees. The female tree is extremely rare; due to the profuse cotton white seeds that she produces many female trees were cut down or not cultivated. And herein lies one of the problems: so few female trees exist (around 600 from a total UK population of around 7,000) that natural fertilisation is almost impossible and even if it did occur, the right conditions of damp, June mud for the short lived seeds to strike are just as extinct, in a landscape drained of its water.

However, Blewbury has one of these rare female trees and even more fortunately we have persons in the village with the knowledge and stewardship skills to aid its survival. Black Poplars are a member of the Willow family and so take readily from cuttings, often referred to us 'truncheons', and this as been done to ensure future generations of this elegant and rarefied tree will remain in our village and landscape. *Glen Meadows*

The speed indicator devices (SIDs) are now live and collecting data on Bessels Way and London Road. Speed Watch and the PC are hopeful that the SIDs, together with the road roundels and bigger repeater signs on Bessels Way, will lead to a general reduction in speeding. Data will be monitored over the course of a year, and then the PC will consider whether to pursue further measures.

The zip wire at Ticker's Folly needs extensive repairs to operate safely; it's been too wet to get a vehicle onto the site, but as soon as the weather is predictably drier, repairs will happen.

At Great Western Park the new health centre is now in the hands of the Buckingham, Oxfordshire, Berkshire Integrated Care Board, who need to submit an updated planning application.
