5. County Councillor- Cllr Rebekah Fletcher. January report received and circulated to Council. **Appendix 1 (BPC Website)** Cllr. Fletcher announced the budget for Oxfordshire County Council has now been set, highlighting Council Tax bills will rise by 4.9% across the County in the next financial year due to savings the County have set out across its budget for 2026/27. The balanced budget for the new financial year has been agreed and allocated for highways i.e. potholes and flooding. A proposal has been put forward for an extra disabled parking space within Dibleys, Blewbury.

7. Lengthman's Report – Iain Wood

7.1. ROSPA inspection update- ROSPA report received and circulated to Council. Iain Wood announced the Tipi has now been removed and that the welcome arch to the Play area at TTF will be taken down and shortened, both actioned due to the wood decay. All outstanding works on the zip wire are now complete and the zip wire is now open to the public.

Clubs and Societies

8. Clubhouse

8.1. Council to note Hall Administrator Report. January report circulated to Council.

8.2. **Roof Repairs.** Update on the repair to the Clubhouse roof following the Cricket Season. **(AM & SA)** Cllr. Austin announced she has been in contact with the Cricket Club and they have a meeting arranged in the coming weeks to view and discuss the options for preventative measures to damage on the Clubhouse roof during the Cricket season. Cllr. Austin will update members at the next meeting of Full Council in March.

8.3. To appoint a Chairperson to the Clubhouse Working Group and Grounds Committee. **(AM & SA) Council agreed** unanimously to appoint Cllr. Benedict Scott as Chairperson to the Clubhouse Working Group and Grounds Committee.

9. Tennis Club

9.1. To receive an update on the Tennis Club lease. **(AM)** Cllr. Millman announced the Tennis lease is in the final stages of completion to be signed by the Parish Clerk and the Tennis Club.

9.2. To discuss and agree actions for pathway alongside tennis courts/carpark. **(AM)** Cllr. Millman proposed to dig the pathway out alongside the tennis court and fill with gravel. Council agreed for this to be actioned and a budget was agreed up to the amount of £700.

10. The Malthus Trust

To appoint a BPC Representative to the Trust-To be deferred until further information has been obtained for this role between Blewbury Parish Council and the Malthus Trust.

11. Traffic & Safety

11.1. Speedwatch data report for January and data trends over time. Report received and circulated to Council members.

11.2. Update on installation of traffic calming measures; Wig Wags, informal bollards, crossing at Savages **(AM)** Cllr. Millman explained the reason for the lack of notice to residents of the installation of informal bollards and Wig Wags that have been carried out in the Village. This was due to the lead member at Highways being on annual leave at the time. Thanks were given by all Council members to the Speedwatch team for all their hard work and commitment in driving this forward to date.

12. Environment (AM)

12.1. Cob Wall Ownership/Maintenance/Village Fund **(AC & JS)** Cllr. Saunders explained the history of the Village Cob Wall fund. It was originally set up in around 2008 to fund repairs on the Cob Wall along Curtoys Lane (the only wall which the Parish Council is responsible for maintaining), and had a second aim to help private owners of cob walls look after their walls by arranging professional advice and workshops. The fund was not established as a charity and lapsed when the council moved to funding repairs out of the Parish precept. Council agreed the second aim is still a good one and hopes to arrange a day to celebrate the village cob walls with a workshop on care and maintenance for residents to attend later in the year. Date to be confirmed.

12.2. A417 London Road flood alleviation **(AE & AM)** Cllr. Evason announced contact had been made with local residents of London Road giving permission for the flood alleviation works to be carried out on the lower end of Bohams Road. In response, further investigations with Highways were required prior to work commencing.

12.3. Church End flood alleviation **(AE & AM)** Cllr. Millman reported the value of repairs may need to be revised in order for the works to be put out to tender. An update will be given at the meeting of Full Council once this has been resolved.

12.4. The Cleve / Spring Lane **(AC, JS & LR)** Cllr. Saunders updated Council members on the progress to date, noting letters have been sent to all neighbouring residents following confirming of land ownership. Council agreed to take down current barriers and replace with a gate and combination lock allowing access to the neighbouring residents and the Parish Council for maintenance purposes.

12.5. EV Chargers- Blewbury Village Hall **(AE & LR)** Cllr. Robinson announced a meeting had taken place with the Village Hall and the supplier and recommendations are being considered for the installation of EV Charges at the Village Hall prior to the funding deadline in July 2026. An update will be given at the next meeting of Full Council in March.

12.6. Review of BPC Neighbourhood Plan: **(AM & LR)**

- BPC Plan still has five years to run: to agree which, if any, of the following options to pursue
- A) make minor (non material) modifications which do not affect policies in the plan (e.g. make factual corrections): the Plan will not then require examination of a referendum
- B) make material modifications which do not change the nature of the plan (e.g. housing allocations) but do materially affect the policies in the Plan. This requires an examination but not a referendum.
- C) make material modifications (e.g. housing allocations and new sites) which do change the nature of the Plan. This requires an examination and a referendum
- To agree a working party and timeline to take this forward-

Council agreed to set up a Neighbour Plan working group to review policies (option B above) Cllr. Robinson, Cllr. Millman and Cllr. Evason agreed to be involved in the process.

12.7. Great British Spring Clean March 2026 **(AM)** Cllr. Millman announced the litter pick will be on the 7th March 2026. Cllr. Parkin agreed to attend on behalf of Blewbury Parish Council.

Dear Parish Councillors and residents,

Over the last few weeks, I've been to both the People and the Education & Young People Overview and Scrutiny Committees (OSC).

At People OSC, we looked at our Unpaid Carers Strategy and the Supported Living offer for adults with learning disabilities. Unpaid carers contribute an estimated £184 billion a year nationally, and here in Oxfordshire we have more than 52,000 of them — with half providing over 50 hours of care each week. These people are remarkable, and we need to make sure the support we offer genuinely works for them. Carers Oxfordshire does provide a lot, but many sessions and groups run at times when carers are, understandably, busy caring. I've asked for the timings to be reviewed, so sessions can also run at more accessible times of day.

At EYP OSC, we focused on Education, Health and Care Plans (EHCPs) and EOTAS — the tailored provision for young people whose needs can't be met in school. The good news is that SEND work is moving in the right direction. The latest CQC/Ofsted report shows effective action across all five priority areas identified in 2023, and both EHCP timeliness and quality are improving. That said, the committee still has questions around co-production with parents and carers, as some guidance is still unclear or hard to use. We've put forward several suggestions to improve the EOTAS guidance.

Over the past month, we've had the worst possible weather for our roads: heavy rain followed by repeated freezing. That combination creates potholes very quickly, which is exactly what we're seeing locally and nationally. The council has more than doubled the number of repair crews out on the network, but in this weather, only temporary fixes are possible — the materials simply can't bond properly. Those temporary repairs also don't last as long as they normally would. I've escalated several serious FixMyStreet reports, along with three persistent flooding issues (two in Harwell and one in Blewbury). An engineer will be investigating, but historical flooding problems can take time to resolve. In the meantime, please take extra care on the roads.

Transport update

A4130 Steventon Lights scheme Phase 2 – from now until **April 2026**, Trenchard Avenue will be closed. There are multi-way signals on the High St but two-way traffic will be maintained (in narrow lanes).

Harwell Link Road – **Until 15th May** there will be multi-way signals that may cause delays while Thames Water undertake works. I'll be keeping a particular eye on the quality of these works, as it's a road that was only surface dressed last year.

Wantage Road, Didcot – 9th – 13th February there is work taking place to the telecommunications infrastructure that may cause delays in and out of Didcot for those coming from Harwell.

London Road/Blewbury Hill – 24th – 27th February various works taking place along this section of road (installation of road signs and prep work for forthcoming drainage investigations in March/April). Delays likely, possible two-way signals.

A4130 / A34 Milton Interchange – Closure 27th Feb – 2nd March. There will be a full closure over the weekend for resurfacing and re-marking. This will be extremely disruptive, but is necessary (I've received many resident complaints on this) so please bear with us.

Lower Road to A34 junction, Chilton – 2nd March 9:00 – 15:30 - road closed for vegetation management.

Hi,

Local Government Reorganisation

The official proposals for the three possible proposals to the mandated Local Government Reorganisation have now been put out for official public consultation by the Government.

The online survey is here: <https://consult.communities.gov.uk/local-government-reorganisation/oxfordshire/>

The first page of it links to the three proposals as put forward by the various councils (One Oxfordshire put forward by OCC; Two Councils put forward by Cherwell, South Oxfordshire, Vale of White Horse, West Oxfordshire; Three Councils put forward by Oxford City Council).

My own preferences are that I think One Oxfordshire would be too remote and focused on Oxford itself (but could be made to work), Three Councils doesn't even meet the mandatory requirements given and feels very much like a land-grab by Oxford City; the Two Council proposal looks to me like the best compromise as well as recreating the local region that existed before the 1974 changes.

However, I know you'll all have your own opinions and regardless of what they are, democracy is best served by hearing all the voices; I urge you to respond and make your views heard.

Local Plan

My own residents are painfully aware (from me banging on about it) that the Local Plan rewrite was underway, is crucial for control of housing and infrastructure provision, and was halted last year by the Inspectors disagreeing with us as to the amount of work done on the "Duty to Co-operate" with neighbouring councils. Well, with Oxford City Council only, and specifically on our mutual disagreement with the way housing number targets are generated (we believed that the standard method should be followed; they had their own special method that allocated many more houses to everyone else around, but not themselves).

As it stalled, we were looking at mitigations and alternatives. As our five year land supply remained intact (albeit closer than before), the worst case was avoided, and we were investigating ways to achieve what was in our Local Plan by piecemeal work whilst pushing the legal side for the Local Plan to go ahead.

Well, as it turns out, the Government, in November, made a ruling that due to so many Local Plans being stopped at inspection stage, the Duty to Co-operate "will not be preserved" in the next iteration of the rules, and that any issues in this area should NOT cause Local Plans to be halted.

This was obviously music to our ears, and we since contacted the Inspectors for a procedural meeting as to how to get things moving again.

This procedural meeting has now happened and appeared positive. We suggested an indicative timeline, with any further documents to be submitted as soon as possible and the Inspectors to prepare us for statements prior to the hearings. We'd prefer hearings to be completed in June and July this year.

SESRO

(And no, I'm not calling it "White Horse Reservoir." More like "White Elephant Reservoir.")

Two brief items on this: following the Public Consultation, we're writing to Government, Ofwat, and Thames Water due to the Consultation being a failure. Public Consultations are, as a resident highlighted to me, governed by what are called the 'Gunning Principles', which include that consultations must occur early enough to have the decision changed or affected, and enough information should be given to the public so they can make "Intelligent Consideration."

Not only have Thames Water insisted the main decisions cannot be affected, they gave insufficient information on Flood Management, Emergency Drawdown, Dam Breach and Emergency Plans, Security, Public Rights of Way, Habitat creation, nearby roads and Construction Traffic Management, Infall/Outfall structure and more. Such as how they propose to fill it – Farmoor is running *lower* than at the end of the drought last summer right now (we know they can't fill reservoirs from the Thames when it's *too* wet and
